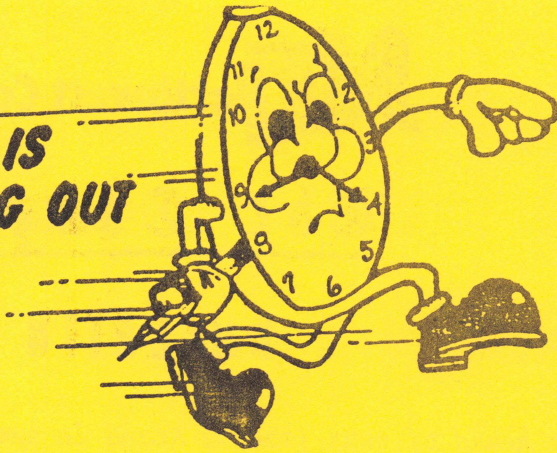

STUDENT HANDBOOK FOR APPEARANCE AND DRESS

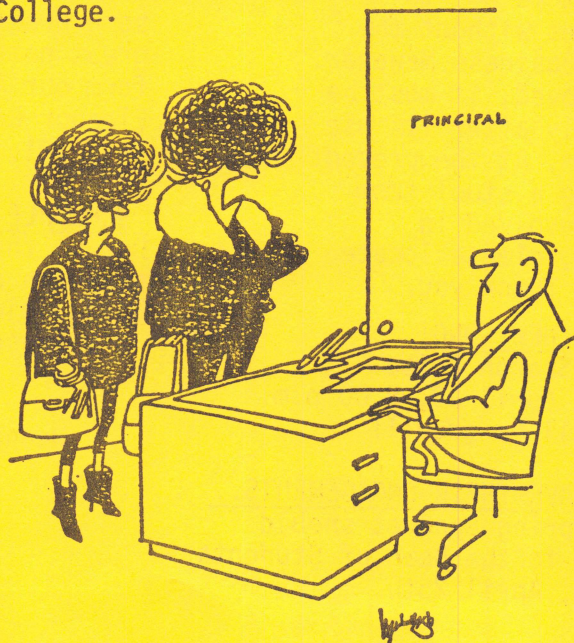
Northwest College students are Christian and collegiate in their appearance and dress. Guiding principles include moderation, modesty, neatness, good taste, and propriety. Appearance or dress which identifies with attitudes, philosophies, or segments of society in opposition to Christian principles is not accepted. Appropriateness to time, place, and activity should determine dress.

In addition to the above information from the Student Handbook, the following guidelines are given for specific direction regarding the "dress code " :

1. Miniskirts are NOT acceptable campus attire in any public area.
2. Shorts are INAPPROPRIATE in classes, chapel, and the Administration Building.
3. Men must wear shirts except when involved in sports activities.
4. As an institution of the Assemblies of God, Northwest College has standards for student behavior based on Biblical precepts and principles, the doctrinal statements of the church, and on widely-held practices in the fellowship. The College will promote Christian Citizenship by instruction, corrective confrontation, and discipline, when necessary for the purpose of development of Christian lifestyle in the students.
