SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES 1986-87:

1. The Assembly of God Division of Home Missions is accepting applications for Ethnic, Black, Native American and Jewish Ministries Scholarship. Applicants must be a student of Ethnic, Black, Native American or Jewish descent who plan to enter into some type of ministry to members of their ethnic or racial group.
