On Thursday March 5, Prof. Johnson's Contemporary Issues class will be showing the documentary STREET WISE second hour in F-7. This film on the street kids of Seattle received some national attention, and an Emmy nomination. Any students who are free at that time are invited to join with the class in watching this film. Here is an opportunity to get a frank look at what life on the streets is like, and to become more aware of the mission field right next door.

An exhibition of 135 photographic panels, 80 artifacts and Holocaust documents, from the date of 1940 to its liberation in 1945.
