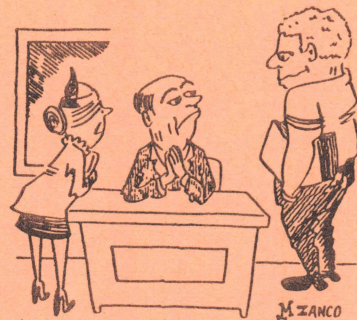

Appearance / Dress: Appropriateness to time, place and activity should determine dress. Guiding principles include moderation, modesty, neatness, good taste and propriety. The way one dresses identifies with their attitudes, philosophies, and principles. While it is appropriate to be in-style, modesty and good taste should not be sacrificed for the "latest".

Neat and clean street clothing is appropriate for most occasions. DRESS-UP clothing is appropriate for church and for CHAPEL participation. Mini-skirts are NOT acceptable wear. SHORTS are inappropriate for class, CHAPEL, library, cafeteria, and the Administration Building. Swimsuits shall NOT be worn on campus. Gym wear should be confined to the gym or approved athletic activities. Grubbies or work clothing are not acceptable for general campus wear and are restricted to the staff dining area in the cafeteria. Unmodest clothing such as; low cut neck line blouses or dresses, short skirts, tight form-fitting pants, skirts, blouses or dresses, are not acceptable anywhere on campus or off campus.
