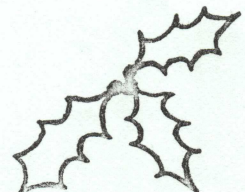
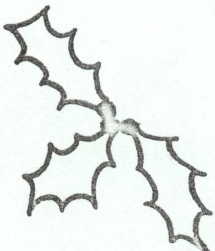
Jim Hackney's Moose rack is still missing from Beatty 200 floor from Open Dorms last Friday night. If you know or have seen anything, please...talk to him.

EXAMINATION SCHEDULE 1987-88

No Semester is officially ended until all tests are completed. Students should not plan to leave campus before the end of the testing schedule and should not ask to take exams early! Students who leave early will receive an "F" on the final. Make your plans for work, travel or weddings with this in mind.

To find the time of your final exams, look for the regular class meeting time below. The day the test is scheduled will then be found at the top of the column, and the time of testing will be found at the left. Physical Education activities classes are tested during their last class meeting rather than during test week. Unless your professor announces otherwise, tests will be conducted in the class' regular meeting place.
