** Future Teacher Conditional Scholarship

Applications for 1987-88 are available in the Financial Aid Office. Scholarships of \$3,000.00 will be awarded to students, based on academic achievement, leadership and community service. There will be two application periods this year. Scholarships for the 1987-88 academic year will be awarded to those students currently enrolled in a Washington postsecondary institution. Completed applications should be mailed to the Higher Education Coordinating Board January 30, 1988. Applications for 1988-89 will be available in March.

** Mensa Scholarship Program

Awards will be made on the basis of an essay of fewer than 550 words which describes the applicant's career, vocational or academic goal toward which the scholarship is to provide aid. An application and further information may be obtained in the Financial Aid Office.
