CHANGE IN ACADEMIC POLICY
(effective Spring Semester, 1989)

The following policy has been adopted by the College for implementation this coming semester:

Course withdrawals through the second Friday of class instruction will have no effect on the transcript. Course withdrawals during week three through the eighth Friday of class instruction (March 10th this year) will result in "W" (Withdrawal) on the transcript. Course withdrawals during week nine through the last day of class instruction will receive a "WS" (Withdrawal Satisfactory - C average or above) or a "WU" (Withdrawal Unsatisfactory - D average or below). The assignment of "WS" or "WU" will be done by the instructor of the course. Students who don't complete a course but fail to withdraw in the Office of Admissions and Records will receive their earned grade.
