STUDENTS WIN NINE AWARDS AT COEUR D'ALENE INTERCOLLEGIATE SPEECH PROGRAM: The ten students who traveled to the final speech tournament of the year, held at the Coeur d'Alene resort in Idaho, brought home a total of nine awards. Competing against fourteen other colleges and universities and more than 110 contestants, N.C. students won recognition in every speech event entered. Not counting debate, N.C. speakers won the third largest number of awards. Counting debate and speech events together, N.C. ranked sixth in total winning points. Congratulations to the following contestants: Loren Hutsel, First Place Novice Persuasion; Joshua Banda, Second Place Junior Extemporaneous, (the tournament's largest event), and Second Place Communication Analysis; Deanna Stone, Third Place Championship Poetry and Third Place Junior Drama; Bob Grim, Second Place Novice Programmed Reading; Keiko Ikeda, Third Place Communication Analysis. Other students who competed at Coeur d'Alene were Craig Gorc, Troy Baxter, Katrina Stobbe and Terry Andrews. Note: Students who want to compete next year need to arrange a meeting with Professor Gillespie before the end of the semester.
