There has been a change of policy regarding CLEP credits effective with our new 1990-92 college catalog. "All credits earned through CLEP must be completed prior to the start of the junior year. Transfer students entering with junior standing will be allowed one semester to earn CLEP credits." There will be some flexibility in the application of this new guideline for the first year, and exceptions will be granted as needed to seniors who entered NC under a different catalog. All other students are asked to plan ahead carefully. If you have questions ... please feel free to stop by the Office of Admissions and Records.
