SUMMER SCIENCE AT NORTHWEST COLLEGE: Reservation fee must be paid by March 1st. Class limit of 9 on a First come basis (a second section will be added if 13 to limit of 18 prepay). Class normally meets daily from 8-10AM, plus field trips.

Topics in Field Ecology, 5 credits, includes lab. May 7 - June 1 We will make the campus our base for the first two weeks, with three to four half day field trips to local sites of interest. The third and fourth weeks will see us in campus Mondays and Fridays with weekends free. Tuesday - Thursday will be spent in the field including overnight. Assignments will include readings, journal entries, discussion groups, and written assignments.

It is also possible to take either one of the two weeks as a stand alone course without lab credit.

Local Issues in Ecology, 2 credits. Meets May 7 - 18th.
Urban ecology. Two four hour field trips per week required.
Volcano, Ocean, & Forest, 3 credits. Meets may 21st - June 1st.
Mondays 8 - 12 AM . Tuesday - Thursday off campus overnight.
Fridays meets 8 - 10.

COSTS Regular tuition and \$10.00 lab fee. Extra charges of \$130.00 for the full four weeks; or \$30.00 for the first two weeks, \$110.00 for the 3rd and 4th weeks to cover food and lodging costs while off campus. Students must pay reservation fee of the non-refundable extra charges by March 1st. Extra charges are non-refundable because they are paid out in advance for lodging and facility reservations that the College cannot retrieve. Money will be refunded if the course is not offered.
