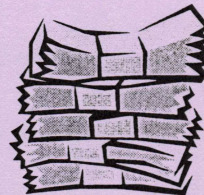

HEALTH TIPS**FROM NC HEALTH SERVICES****The "Cold" Hard Facts:**

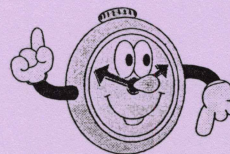
- Cold climates or climate changes do not cause colds.
- Colds and flu are one of the primary reasons for physician office visits.
- The average adult get 3-5 colds per year's children average 6-8 colds per year.
- Antibiotics do no cure a cold or flu.
- Cold are caused by over 200 viruses.

Self-care/Symptom relief:

- Get plenty of rest.
- Use a humidifier or vaporizer to loosen mucus and relieve nasal stuffiness.
- Drink plenty of fluids - water, fruit juices, hot tea, or chicken soup.
- Sleep with your head raised on pillows.
- Use over-the-counter medications such as Advil, Advil Cold & Sinus, Robitussin Syrups, Robitussin Cold and Dimetapp Extentabs and Elixir, to relieve cough, cold, and flu symptoms.
