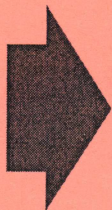

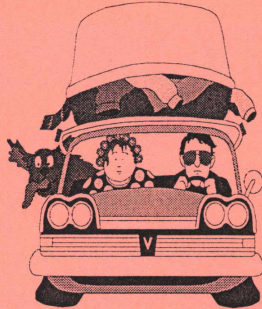
## SUMMER COLLEGE REGISTRATION PROCEDURE:

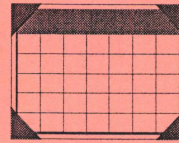
