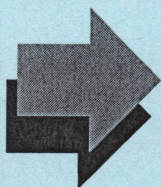

CONGRATULATIONS to Roger Altizer and Ryan Doughty for placing third in Senior Parliamentary debate last weekend at the Whitman College tournament. Roger and Ryan had a six wins to one loss record going into semi-finals, where they lost on a two to one decision of the three judges. Twenty eight colleges and universities attended one of the largest and most competitive meets of the year. Other awards: Roger, tenth best Debate Speaker (out of 54), Ryan, Finalist in Extemp; Louise Wall, Finalist in Prose reading and Third place in Drama reading. Next tournament is nationals in Houston, Texas on March 23.

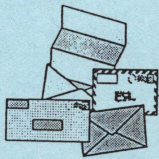
SUMMER COLLEGE SCHEDULES are now available in the Registrar's Office.

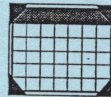
