

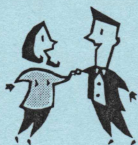

GRADUATES AND NON-RETURNING STUDENTS

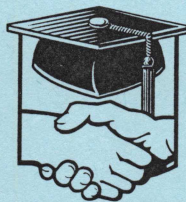
