

**DEBATERS WIN AGAIN** - Following their First place win at the Lower Columbia College debate tournament two weeks ago, on Nov 17 the team of Jacob Witt and Ryan Doughty won Third place at Linfield College. 29 colleges and universities attended the 64th annual event, one of the largest forensics tournaments in the country. 99 debaters in three divisions argued in 6 prelimination rounds. Then Ryan and Jacob reached semi finals, winning a third place award, competing against 32 other senior teams. In addition our novice team of Josh Brittingham and Doug Lloyd received 8th place (out of 34 novice teams) for reaching quarter finals. Our other novice team of Troy Anderson and Jeremy Kowalski reached Octo finals (top 16). In individual speaking events, the following students reached final rounds: Josh Brittingahm-extemp, Amyjoy Munson--Prose Interpretive reading. Louise Wall--Prose and Poetry Program reading.
