- Third Session: August 4th - August 22nd

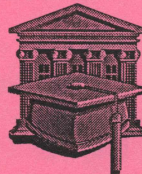

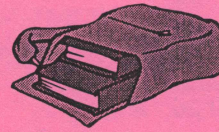
