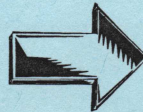


NORTHWEST COLLEGE GOLF TOURNAMENT:

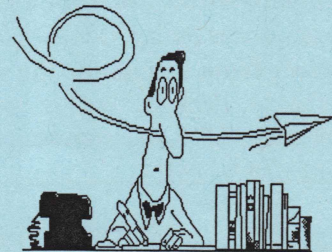

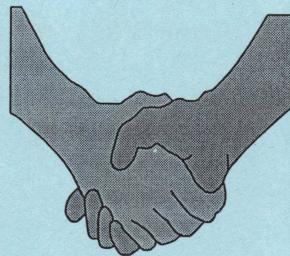

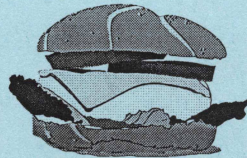
