

BE OFFERED IN SPRING. We're taking another step in developing the program that helps you to help others with their physical as well as spiritual needs. If you are seriously wanting to get a background in Biointensive science, you need this course as this course will be the prerequisite for enrollment in other Biointensive science and business classes.

SCIE/BUSM 270 Principles of Biointensive Science, 4 cr. (includes lab credit)

Foundations of chemistry, nutrition, philosophy, and microeconomic development as it applies to <u>BioIntensive</u> food production. Includes ecological recovery of damaged environments, food production and preservation, genetics, and stock selection. 3 lectures and one 2 hour lab per week. Permission of instructor required.


