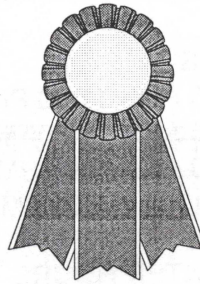
SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS

Only the 2 best teams from each school were permitted to attend. **Josh Brittingham** and **Jacob Witt** won an **octo-finalist award**. **Jacob** won **First place Best Speaker** with 167 points, the highest ranking of the sixty-four debaters at the tournament.
