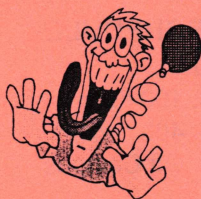

## ANOTHER WIN FOR OUR TOP IN STATE DEBATE PROGRAM

Congratulations to **Josh Brittingham** and **Paul Nystrom** for winning a **quarter finalist award** at the University of Oregon debate tournament last weekend. 30 colleges and universities brought 28 senior division debate teams. Nystrom also won an award for ranking as the fourth best speaker out of 56 competitors. Brittingham was the sixth best speaker. This is the third trophy in four tournaments. Last week the national standings were announced and Northwest ranked as the top debate program in the state.
