




# TO OUR DEAN...



# Administration

The initial step toward production could not be accomplished without the persistent toil of the laborer. This requires untiring effort, determination, and diligent performance.








A man of true unwavering faith, A faultless memory, His systematic method is correct. An asset to our teaching staff, A punctual man is he. He holds our admiration and respect.





# **MESSAGE TO THE HARVESTERS...**

Long, black scars were furrowed across the face of the prairie as the settler prepared to plant his first seed in virgin soil. He knew a good harvest began with deep plowing. Following the plowshare came the disc and drag, pulverizing the soil until all was fallow. It was all so tedious, and care had to be taken, for the toiler had an object for which he strove—the harvest!

The seed selected with care and liberally sown was then kissed by the sun and watered from Heaven. A miracle took place—an unseen germ of life hidden within that seed reproduced itself, some thirty, some sixty, and some an hundredfold. The shout of the harvesters was but full fruition of the work of the plowman-sower, to whom God gave the increase.

"HARVESTERS," your name is well chosen—it is eloquently suggestive! May the coming years never dim its significance from your spiritual vision.

For three years now your lives have been plowed—deeply, we trust —by precept and example. Trials, like disc and drag, have mellowed the ground as you have grown in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ. The dynamic kernels of His Word have been planted; and who can forget those precious outpourings of the Holy Spirit when He fell like rain upon us, and classes gave way to worship, praise, and heart-searching consecration? The result is this class, Northwest Bible Institute's largest to date, going forth to bless the world. But this is not the end, for your education is simply a means to an end. How impossible at this time to estimate the harvest as the process of sowing and reaping repeats itself.

All life is a continuation of this process. You are going forth bearing precious seed. To the whitened fields, oh Harvesters!—and God bless you and keep you until the day we all come rejoicing, bringing our sheaves with us.




# FRESHMAN CLASS MESSAGE...

Therefore, we "press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus."





# MISSIONARY ACTIVITIES...



# MUSIC...


From the beginning of creation, "when the morning stars sang together, and all the sons of God shouted for joy," music has played a very important role in the Christian's worship of God.






Every week the assignments are posted on the bulletin board. In addition, each class is appointed its night to visit the missions. The assignments are composed of a speaker, song-leader, testimony leader, one who reads the Scripture and takes prayer requests, pianist, combinations of singers and musicians, each student being allotted his particular duty. Besides the regular assignments, students are free to visit the missions any or every night of the week.

The streets of Seattle afford wonderful possibilities for personal evangelism. Street meetings have trained many to become interesting preachers, for here the speaker must learn to attract and hold his audience. Following the open-air service, those who are listening are invited into the mission. Here one meets people of various nationalities men and women who know the bitterness and bondage of sin. It is a common sight to see a row of Uncle Sam's colored soldiers kneeling in prayer together with a band of earnest students seeking to pray them through to victory. This is where young men and women develop a love for lost souls and lay the foundation for a future missionary career. Many rescued in these missions are now living victorious Christian lives, and some now service as missionaries on the field.

Of paramount importance is the Sunday School work, where can be put into practice the studied methods of Sunday School organization and child evangelism.


For those who desire different avenues of service, there are constant calls to assist in many churches. Radio work has also proved to be a wonderful channel for those gifted with musical and vocal talents. Anyone so desiring can find opportunity for visitation work in the large hospitals, or can join the bands who visit the County jail. At the Luther Burbank School for Boys on Mercer Island, one is always assured of an audience of wide-awake attentive youngsters who readily respond to the call to accept Christ.

Not only must students learn from books, well-educated and experienced teachers, but they must put in practice the things they learn in order to be effective ministers of the Gospel; hence the students are happy for the privilege of obtaining practical experience in every line along with their School training.




1945-46 PIONEER GROUP OF G.I.'s

"Hut, hoop, heep, hope, hut, hoop, heep, hope," these and various other wierd sounds eminated from the street in front of Northwest Bible Institute. To the untrained ear it was merely a jumble of noises. To the trained military ear it was distinct, crisp orders. Those were not rifles they were carrying; they were swords, Bibles—the Word of God. They were the "Pioneer" group of former servicemen that had begun the fall term of 1945.'46. They were now soldiers of the cross, no longer soldiers of the United States of America. They were obeying crisp orders, "Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the Word of truth."

Many former servicemen have stayed true to their "fox-hole" consecrations, and have followed God's call to Bible School. The Northwest Bible Institute enrolled eighteen veterans in 1945-'46, and in 1946-'47 that number has increased to ninety-two. Many of this number definitely feel the call of God to labor in the foreign fields as missionaries; others to labor in the homeland as Christian workers, evangelists, and pastors.

A large percentage of the GI's now attending Northwest Bible Institute have seen foreign service and actual combat duty. Many have been awarded medals for meritorious service, wounds in action, conduct, fidelity, and valor.

As these men carried the implements of warfare to the four corners of the earth, so may they now carry the implements of warfare against sin and Satan. May they carry the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ, who alone can set the captive soul free.






Alumni
