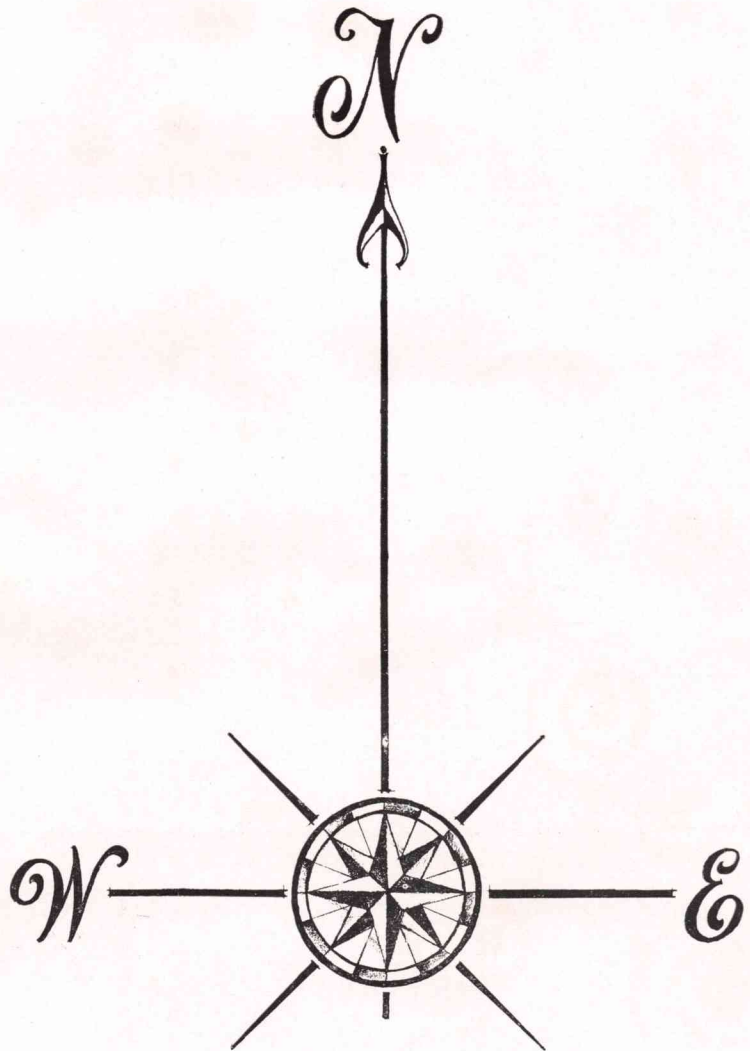

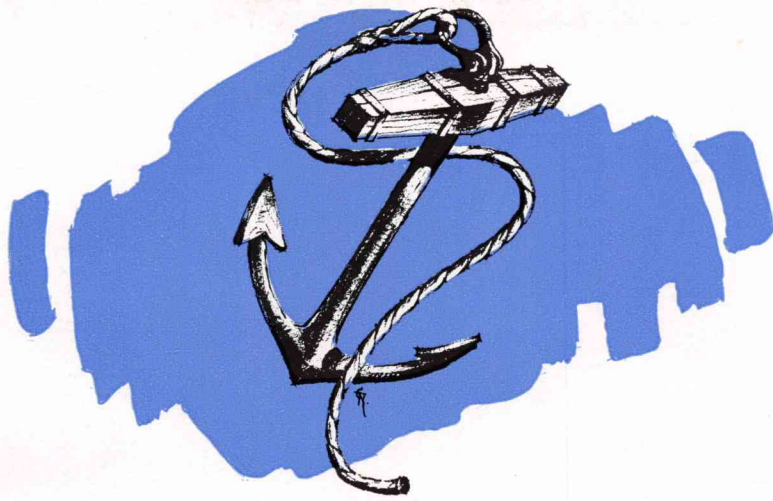

THE raging fury of the storm-swept sea—the cry of distress—the signal of the faithful watch—to the rescue!

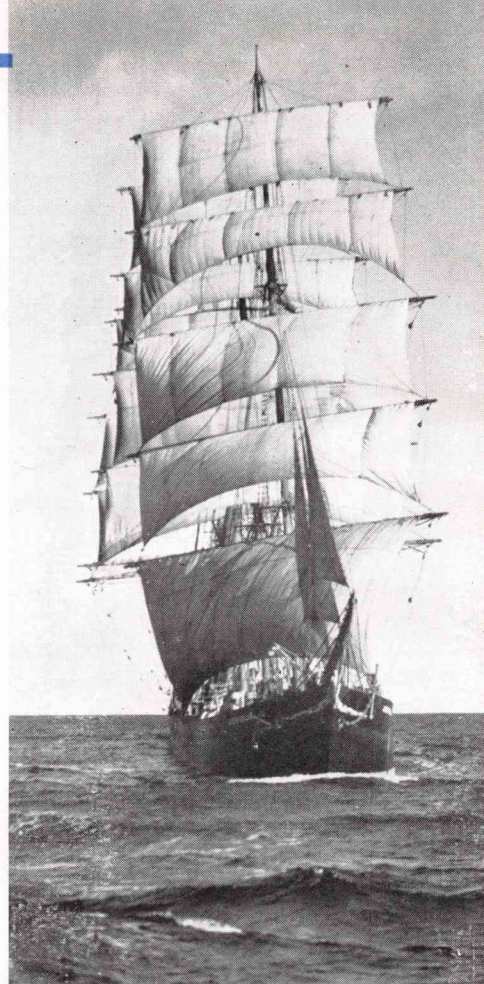

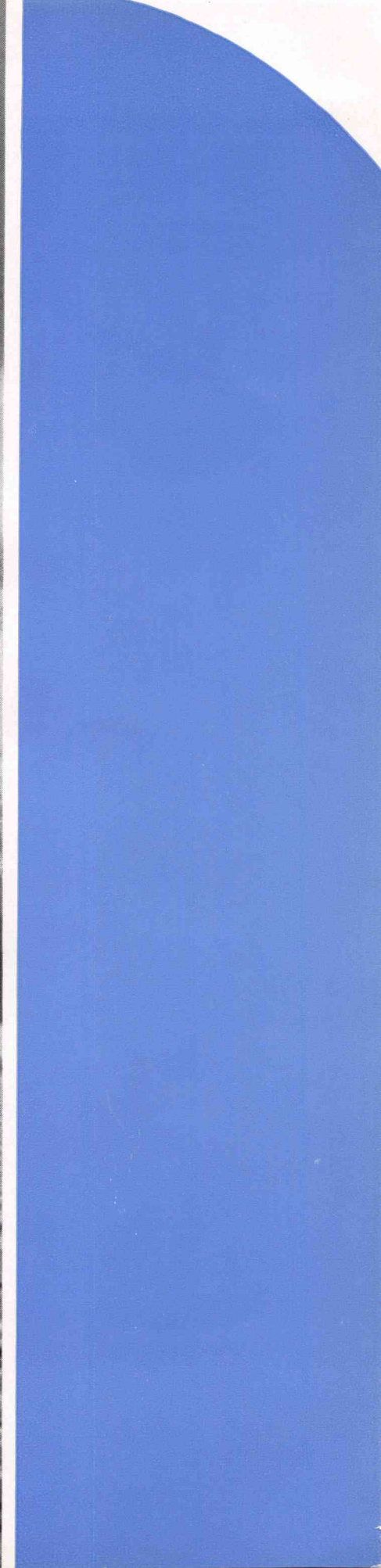
Dedication . . .

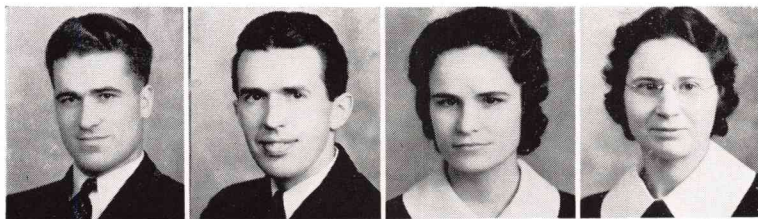
Junior Class

Two things have claimed much of our attention during our student days at N. B. I. We have learned to discover the riches of God's grace and to feast upon those delectable things in meditation.

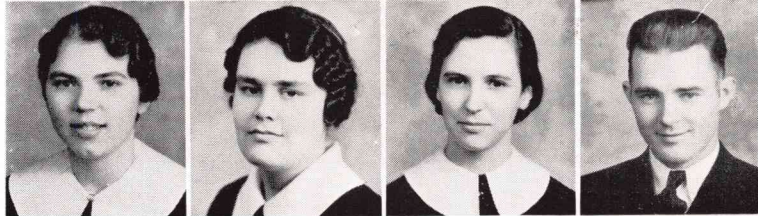

A Visit to the Good Ship N. B. I.

For some time it had been the desire of your correspondent to witness the Friday afternoon preparations at N.B.I. for week-end maneuvers. All week long the midshipmen are busy with the technique of life saving, but week-ends they make their way out into troubled waters for practical experience.

Boarding the training ship, we were met by a business-like executive whom we discovered to be the Principal, Commodore Ness, who has been so instrumental in establishing and developing this remarkable Institute. In his wake appeared a delightfully refreshing little man with a twinkle in his eye, but withal the business-like air of a secretary, who was introduced to us as Dean Beatty, the first mate. In a trice Commodore Ness had taken control of the situation and was introducing us to the matron, Mrs. Christenson, and she presented us to Miss Hansen, the purser; Miss Morris, the stewardess; and Mrs. Giles, the nurse. Already we were feeling at home with the friendly crew of the good ship N. B. I. when some more members appeared. Mates Bogue, Bronson, and Jones made their appearance with Bandmaster Cox, and we found them as delightful company as the officers we had already met.

Making our way into the assembly hall we found a group of sailors receiving last-minute orders before venturing forth on one of their rescues. In an adjoining room another group of midshipmen was being given some special instruction in rescuing children. No pains are spared in this Institute to acquaint the candidates with the technical problems peculiar to each type of rescue. Across the corridor we heard the strains of a song; some bandsmen were tuning up. Presently, a splendid baritone voice began to sing:

"Jesus, Saviour, pilot me
Over life's tempestuous sea;
Unknown waves before me roll,
Hiding rock and treach'rous shoal;
Chart and compass came from Thee:
Jesus, Saviour, pilot me."

We felt our hearts suddenly melt and a lump climb into our throats. (Oh, that all people would take Jesus as pilot! There would not then be the necessity of sending out life savers to rescue men from moral and spiritual shipwreck.)

Advancing along the corridor, we heard the clatter of a typewriter recording the ship's log. A copy of this publication goes forth periodically, acquainting the outside world with the activity of the midshipmen.

By this time we were quite prepared for what was the matron's suggestion. Appetizing odors had been making their way from the galley and had more than once started us thinking about nourishment; so when the suggestion came to descend into the hold of the ship to enjoy a little snack, we were completely disarmed.

Footsteps outside the galley announced the approach of one of the rescue crews. One of the lifeboats was to be lowered nearby, and we were to witness its launching. An afternoon spent in prayer had given the crew complete confidence in the success of their venture. We watched them take their places, handled their lines, and pushed them off with a hearty "God bless you!"

We have been thinking about our visit to N. B. I. a good deal of late, and it is our intention to pay another visit there soon. Won't you join us?

Practical Work

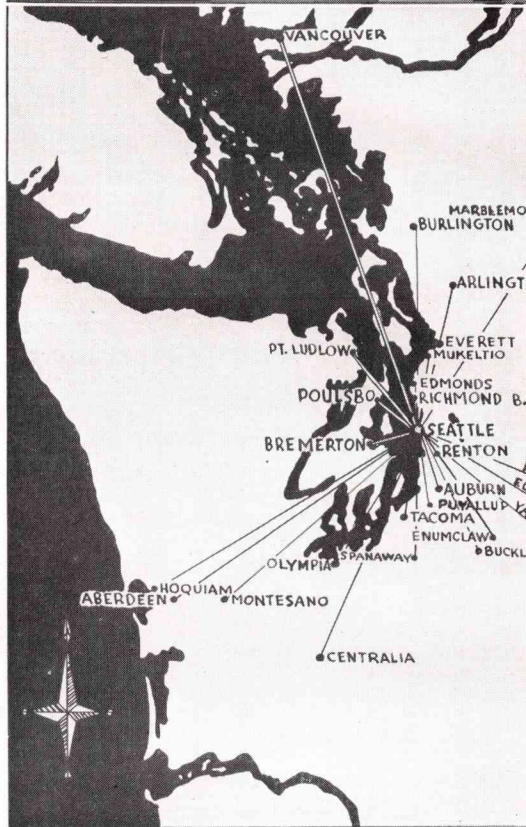
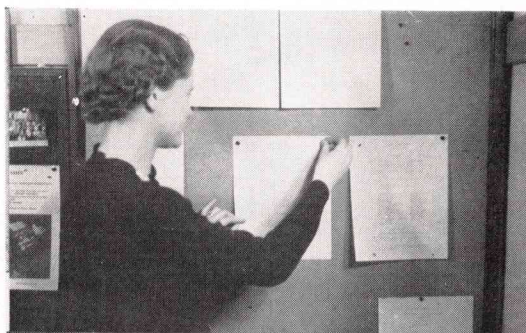
“And whatsoever ye do, do it heartily, as to the Lord, and not unto men.”—Colossians 3:23.

Missionary Society

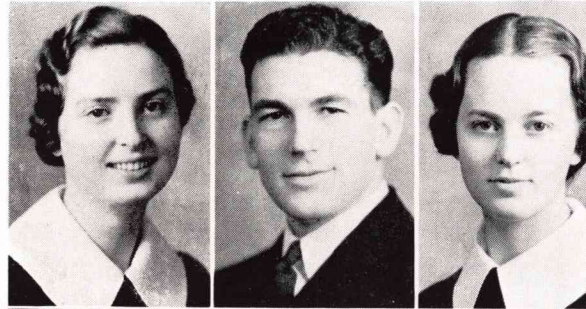
The program of the Missionary Society may be summed up under three headings: pray, give, go.

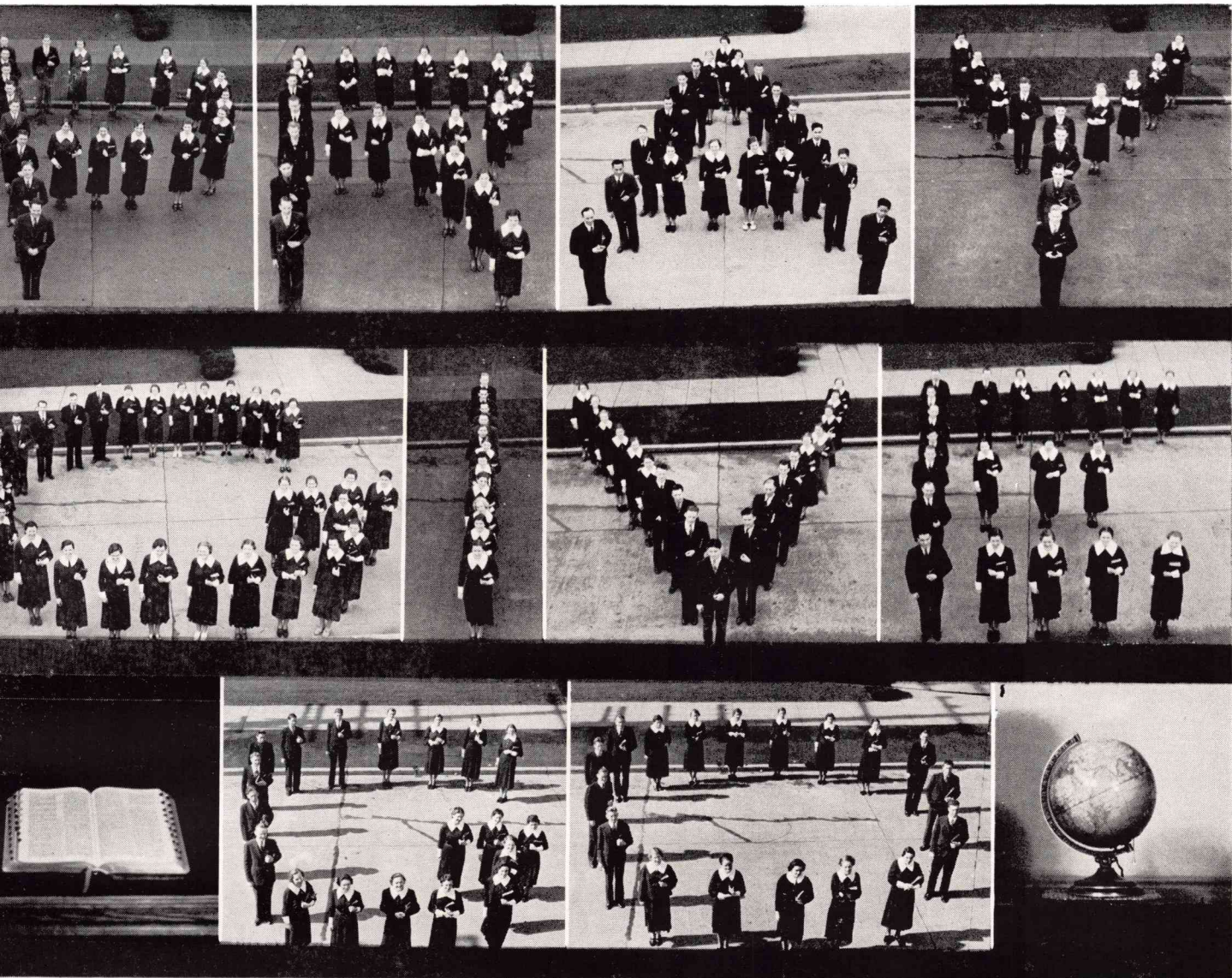

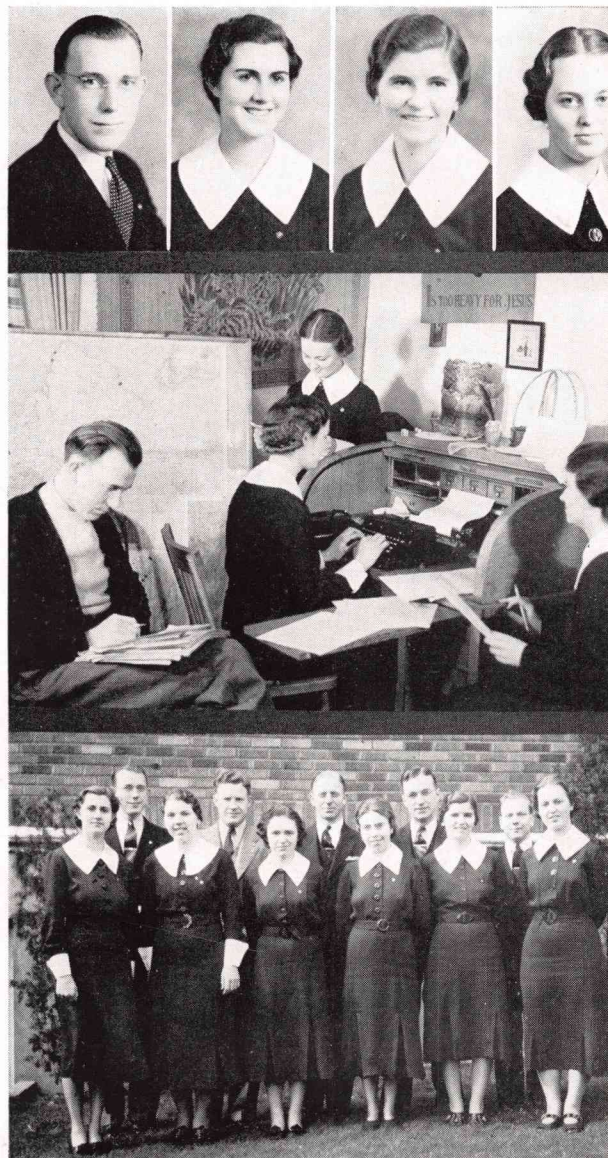

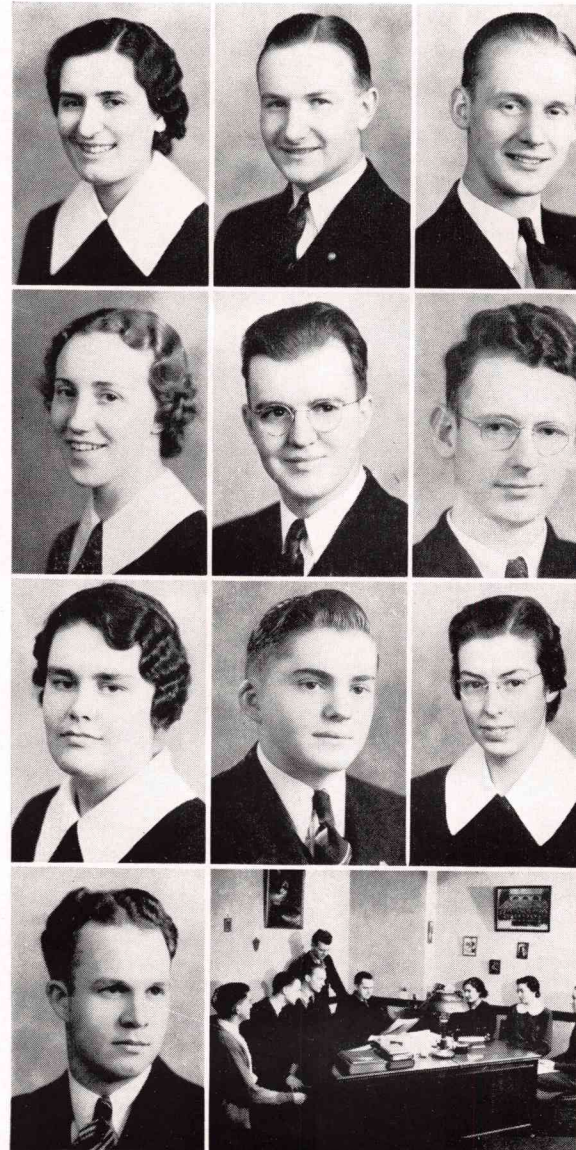
Anchors aweigh! In the Fall of '38 the Good Ship "Annual" left the shores of N. B. I., to undertake its third voyage over the ocean of publication.

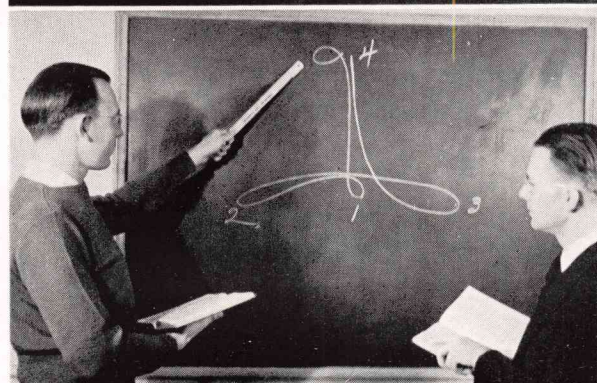
