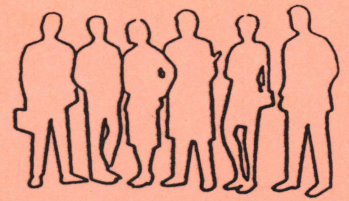

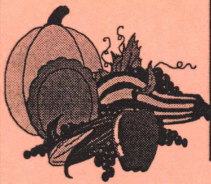

"TEAM PLAYER" RECEIVES TOP SPOT IN SURVEY

A survey of 125 companies in 35 industries reveals that employers rate "team players" as the No. 1 workplace value. The work-trait study was conducted by Challenger, Gray & Christmas, INC., in Chicago.

Nearly 40% of the bosses and managers who were surveyed ranked "team player" as top among seven desirable work traits. Moreover, 80% chose it as either first, second, or third on their wish lists. The other traits covered in the survey were: "self-starter," "dependable," "company-focused," "responsible," "adaptable," and "likable."

While "family values" has been a heavily debated social issue in recent years, the survey indicates that similar workplace attributes are of increasing concern to employers. Organizations view the family as a microcosm of their own culture and seek to promote the family values that create harmony among their people," observes James E. Challenger, president of the firm that conducted the survey.

Employees. "Increasing worldwide competition makes it mandatory for companies to obtain all the value they can from their employees.

This is reflected in the fact that "team player" was named as the top workplace value.
