The Hurst Library had some significant good news in the last re-accreditation visit from the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities, our regional accrediting body. Coming in the form of a Commendation, it reads as follows: "The committee commends the library and information services departments for their proactive customer service and planning, resulting in providing connectivity to electronic resources, up to date equipment, and service in support of the educational program throughout and beyond the campus."

Of course there were some recommendations regarding the Library as well. Recommendation 5: "Although the institution has made significant progress in providing electronic resources, the committee recommends that the college take steps necessary to improve the library's print and media collection which is inconsistent in coverage and lacks the depth needed to support the academic programs of the institution." And then part of Recommendation

7: "...provide library resources appropriate to support the graduate programs;..."

While proud of the Commendation, we earnestly seek to assist the College in responding to Recommendations 5 and 7. To quote Churchill, "We shall not fail or falter; we shall not weaken or tire...Give us the tools and we shall finish the job."

On another note, though costs have increased in virtually every area, negotiations with our database vendors have been fruitful in that costs increases have been small. Through participation in the Statewide Database Licensing Project, consortium agreements, and vendor subscription negotiations, we have been able to increase our electronic resources.
