

Dr. Amos Millard was born in Portland, Oregon and raised in the Vancouver area. He graduated from Battle Ground High School in 1941. His transcript shows He ranked number 2 in his high school graduation class.

Amos Millard came as a student from Brush Prairie, Washington to NC in the Fall of 1945. A couple of the responses on his application to NC I found interesting.

One question was, "Have you skill in any calling?" His answer of "clerical work" turned out to be prophetic.

On the reference form from his pastor it noted concerning Brother Millard: "He is our C.A. leader. A studious person and much appreciated in the church. Also has a class in Sunday School and is secretary treasure of the Church. We will miss him greatly. Our loss is your gain. I am sure He is worthy of acceptance at N.B.I."

He was an outstanding student an Northwest, earning all "A's" except for one "B" in Music III. He graduated "summa cum laude."

Dean Tex will be pleased to know that in addition to his academic work, his transcript reveals Dr. Millard received straight A's in the Conduct Report : "Home and dormitory, Practical work, cooperation, Christian courtesy, and neatness".

He graduate with a diploma in 1948 and a Bachelor of Arts in 1949. This was only the second year that a B.A. was offered at NC.

The same year he graduated with his B.A. he became Registrar of NC and married Lorna Gustafson.

In 1950 he was licenced with the Northwest District and Ordained in 1956.

Dr. Millard attended the Winona Lake School of Theology from 1954 through 1957. This School was Affiliated with Fuller Theological Seminary. He graduated with a Master of Arts in Theology. He also took course work at Northern Baptist Theological Seminary and University of the Pacific. Always the scholar, in all of his work he achieved almost straight "A's".

In the late 1960's his title was changed to Dean of Admissions and Registrar. He served as Acting Academic Dean during the time Dr. Rice was on sabbatical completing his doctorate at Washington State University.

A little over 10 years ago, Amos Millard graduated from the California Graduate School of Theology with a Doctorate of Ministry.

Dr. Millard is also a noted author, with over 100 published articles. He also authored the book Learning from the Apostles and the ICI textbook, Old Testament Historical Books.

Dr. Millard has received many awards over the years, including:

- Delta Epsilon Chi in 1958
- NC Alumnus of the year in 1972
- Faculty Award of the year in 1972
- Who's Who in Washington in 1975
- Who's Who in the West in 1982

Dr. Millard has been active in teaching both in the northwest area of the United States and overseas. He has taught in Taiwan, Malaysia, Singapore, Haiti, the middle East and just last month in Hong Kong.

He has led the "flying seminar" to Israel almost 20 times. By the way his dissertation was "A training tool in Biblical studies for Educational Travel in Israel and Jordan." I had the opportunity to go to Italy, Jordan, Israel and Egypt with Dr. Millard and must tell you one funny incident from that trip.
