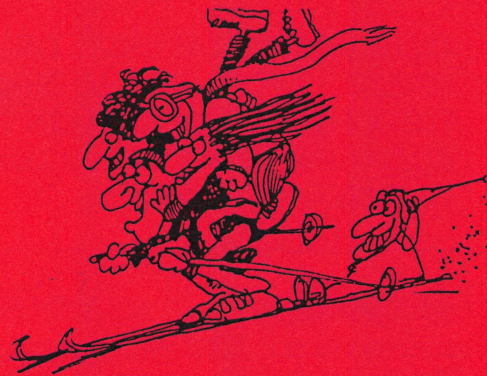

\$5,000 CARL F.H. HENRY SCHOLARSHIP - An invitation for Christian college students to communicate biblical truth to a secular audience through the print media.

The **AMY Foundation's CARL F.H. HENRY SCHOLARSHIP** is designed to recognize creative, skillful writing that presents in a sensitive, thought-provoking manner the biblical position on issues affecting the world today.

To be eligible, authors must write and publish an article containing biblical truth in a secular, non-religious publication and must meet the scholarship criteria listed below. All articles must include a direct quote from the Bible.

CONTEST RULES

ELIGIBILITY

1. Authors submitting entries must be current full-time students of Christian colleges which hold membership in the Christian College Coalition.
2. To be eligible, the article must have been published in a secular, non-religious publication as determined by the awards panel (Christian college newspapers do not qualify).
3. The article must have been published during the year defined by the dates given as the AMY Foundation Scholarship year: May 1, 1993 through April 30, 1994.

SUBMISSION

1. The entry must be in the form of the actual full page, containing the publication name and date.
2. The entry must be accompanied by a cover letter including the author's name, college, graduation year, and summer address and phone.
3. All entries must be sent to the Christian College Coalition and postmarked on or before June 1, 1994.

CONTENT

1. At some point, God's Word must be decisively and directly quoted.
2. Such quotation must be acknowledged as coming from the Bible.
3. Biblical quotations must be taken from an accepted and popular edition of the Bible, such as the New International Version, the New American Standard Bible, the King James Version, the Revised Standard Version, or the Living Bible.
4. The article must present the biblical position as relevant, timely and deserving of thoughtful consideration.
5. Examples of issues appropriate for discussion (but authors are not limited to these) are family life, divorce, value trends, media impact, entertainment, pornography, political morality, U.S. national interest, abortion, religion, and addiction to drugs and alcohol. The biblical impact on individual character and outlook is also an appropriate theme.

JUDGING

1. Qualified articles will be judged by the following primary considerations:
 - a) Persuasive power of the article
 - b) Author's skill in relating God's Word to current issues
 - c) Author's sensitivity in presenting a biblical response to the intensified search for meaning in life.
2. Decisions by the judges and awards panel are final.

AWARD

The winning article will be announced on or before September 1, 1994 and the scholarship of \$5,000 will be applied toward the author's educational expenses at the Christian college he/she attends.
