Hobbies - moving pictures, collections etc.

Coming back to vacation - don't go to the same places twice.

#### VII. Ministers mental life.

A minister's mind must be a well informed mind therefore he must give himself to much reading. Look magazines, current events + other informative literature. Besides knowledge received in Bible School we should continue to study. By having this knowledge of current events you will be in confidence. A minister is a teacher! Listen to lectures and speeches where by you may learn.



A minister must have a clear mind so what ever you feed your mind must be clear and pure.

VI. The minister's Spiritual life & duty.

Must maintain high spirituality, he must allot portions of his time for private meditation, prayer, & Bible study.

VII. Duty to family & Home.

Must be an example as a husband and a father to the flock. Children should be well brought up. The minister's duty is first to his own home.

VIII. Financial matters -

Keep out of debt. It is embarrassing to family & congregation to be in debt. It is a charge to be dismissed from council if you fail to pay your debts. Don't stay away from the person to whom you owe money. Don't let them run after you rather go see him & explain if you're having financial difficulty.

IX. Ministerial Discounts -

Some stores give 10% discount to ministers. Never ask for it & if you don't need it don't even accept it. Don't become a beggar.

X. Ministerial Fees

A minister has no set fee. Funeral fees vary from nothing on up. If you <sup>ever</sup> get any thing before you do say thing about it. Shepherds & ministers services are free.

XI. Ministers Dress -

Never charge any one for services rendered.  
Dress as neatly & clean as possible.

XII. Clerical Gait - We don't love that in our movement.

Don't make fun of the way when ministers (Priest etc) dress. It will add nothing to your ministry to ridicule. If you can attack a doctrine then you've found some thing. The way they dress or eat has nothing to do with their religion. Don't try to make people live Christianity before they are converted.

1. In the pulpit - some churches have a custom where by you must wear a gown.
2. In public places - never wear a gown in public. Catholics however do.

#### XIV

### Minister as a Citizen.

Besides being a servant of God is also a servant of the community. Minister is often called upon for public prayers, addresses in civic & national assemblies. Don't compromise!

#### XV

### Minister's Privilege of Citizen

1. A usually exempt from jury duty. It's wise to take full.
2. Minister is not summoned to Army in time of War.
3. State <sup>cannot</sup> force minister to any service that violates his religious convictions.
4. State cannot force a minister to testify against any person.

#### XVI

### Political or Social questions

Should not enter politics to represent party has to support righteousness - The good man. Minister <sup>pastor</sup> only has the right bar is obliged to speak upon purely moral questions in or out of the pulpit. When a minister speaks on burning moral questions involved in political or other issues he must be sure that he understands thoroughly every phase of the situation. Be sure you know what you're talking about.



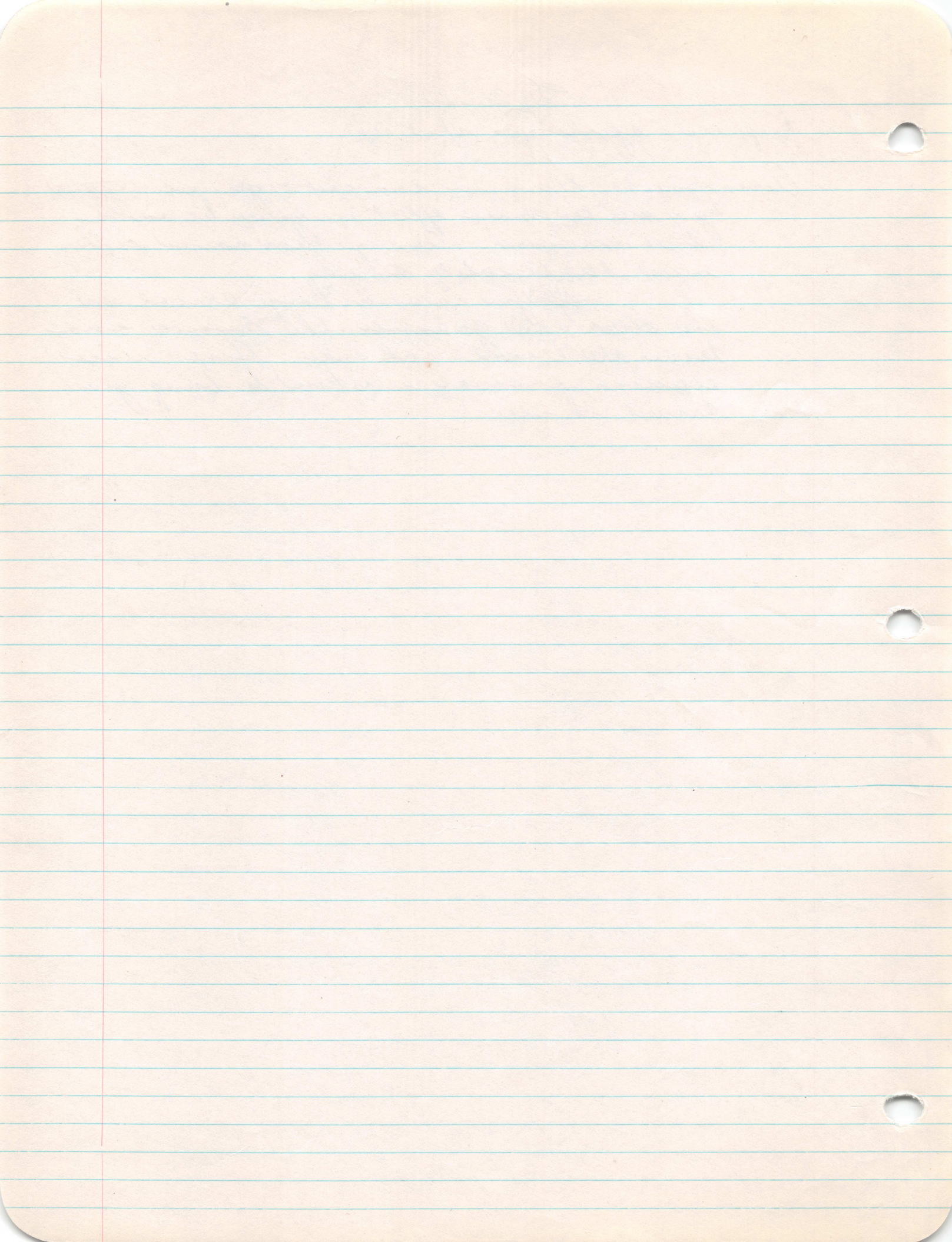
## Missions

Keep up - speak up - shut up

If you have a large crowd on the street don't go inside the mission and leave the crowd out side. Have "voice" efficient personal workers to bring your crowd inside.







I. Minister-Pastor  
Regarding Partiality.

Many a Church has split because the pastor became partial. Most splits are caused because of pastors. Pastors should be careful not to side in with different people in the Church. When a new pastor comes to a Church those people who caused trouble before will try to get on the good side of the pastor. It is best not to be too friendly with your congregation so there will be no cliques. Naturally you should have personal friends that are only human. You had close intimates friends such as Mary, Martha Lazarus and Peter. Even the Peter was a best friend Jesus spoke harsh to him when he said "Get behind me Satan."

A pastor is first of all on the Lord's side and should be on the Lord's side always. You should be about "your" Father's business and not about every body else's business, that's secondary. We must be friendly etc. but first of all we are the Lord's.

Partiality will create jealousy. You will cause others to dislike you because you pay too much attention to others.

Partiality should be avoided because it is likely to cause a split. The pastor took against the other's. Don't be exceptional friends to those who have money.

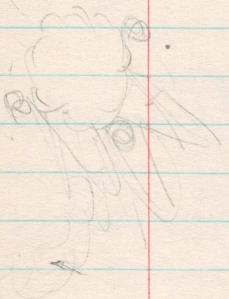
II. Regarding Idle Gossip and Personal Opinions

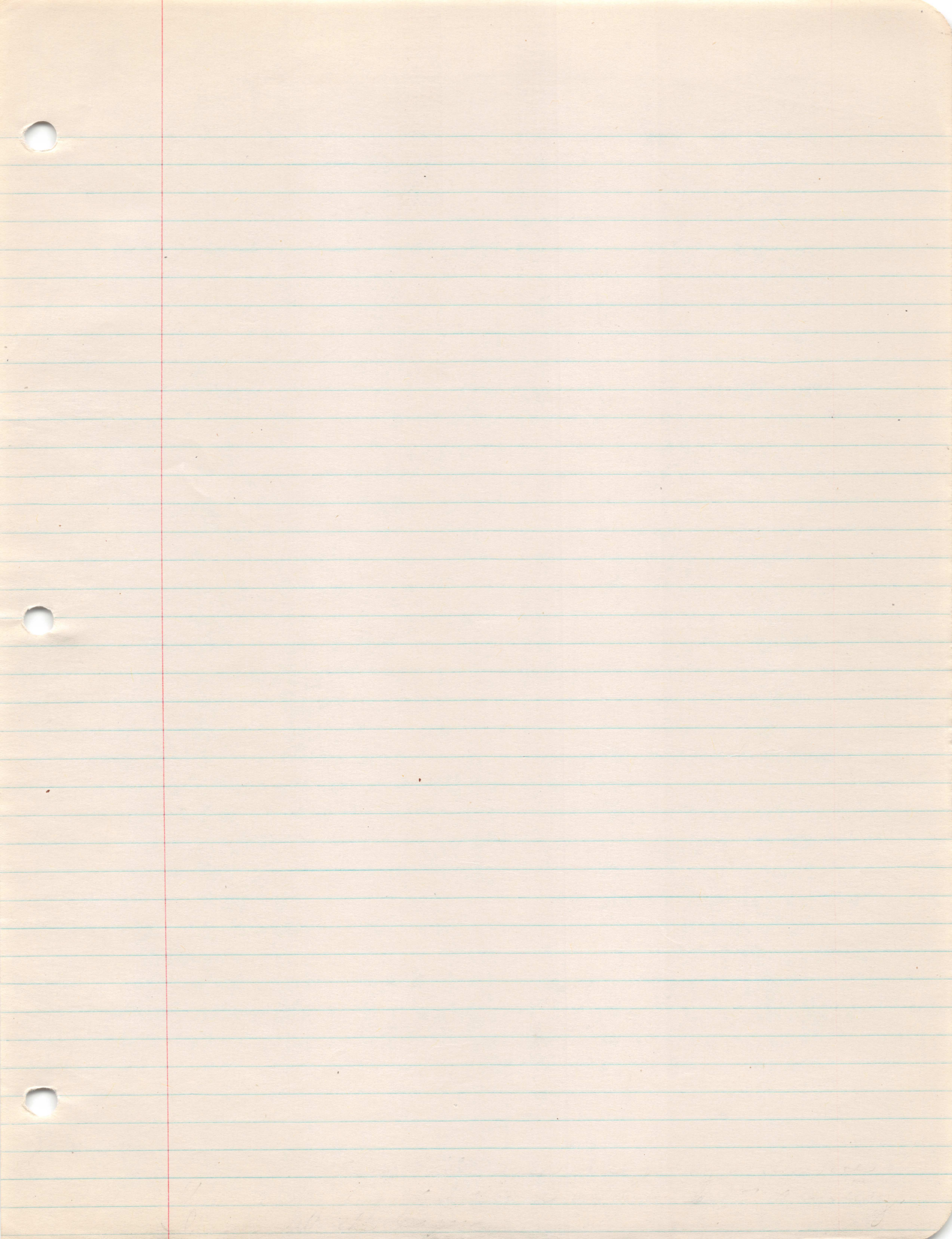
get embarrassed later.

If you're called on for your personal opinion - Be careful and if it may get you in a tight squeeze try to get out of expressing your own opinion.

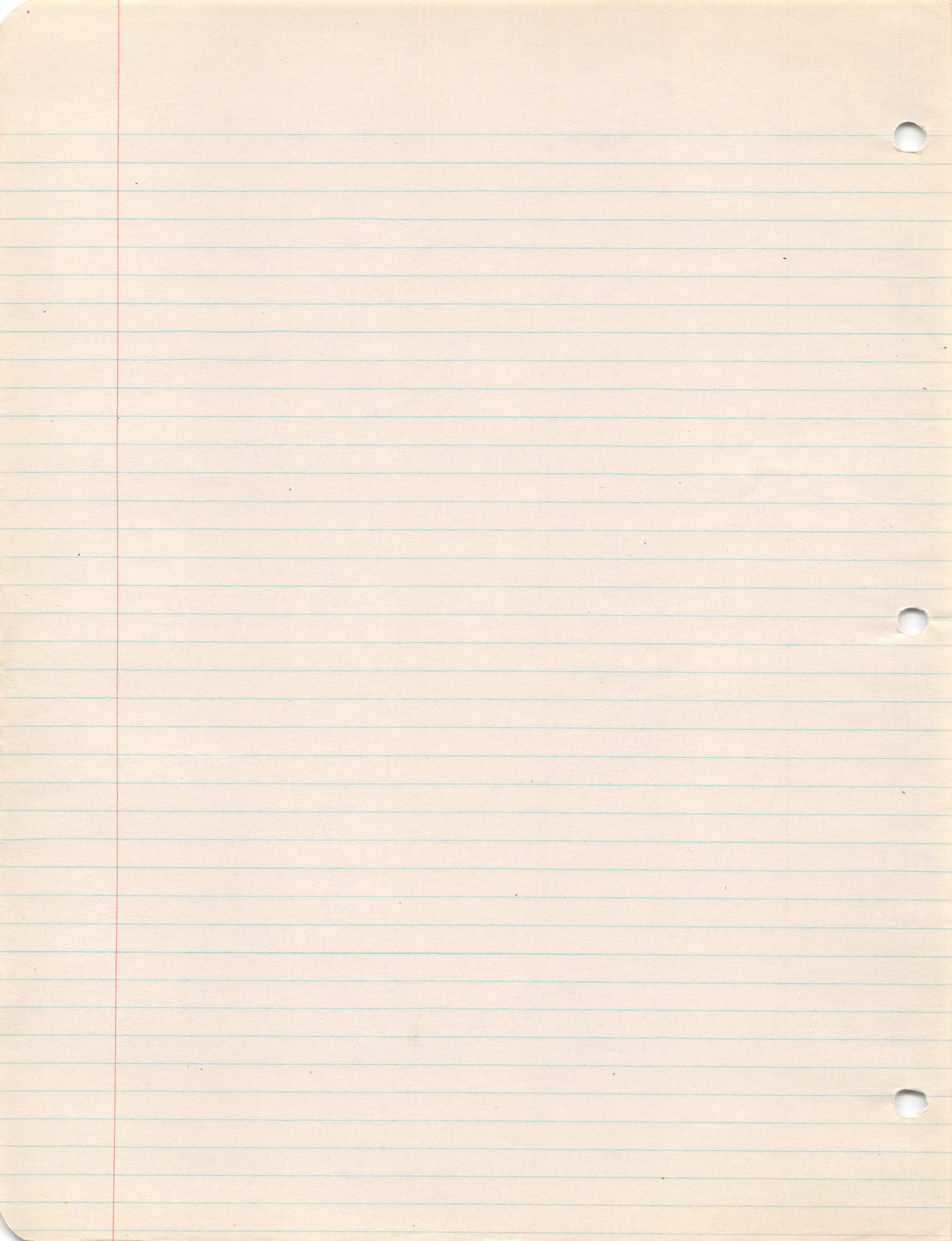
Never tell anyone they're going to hell because they go to church they smoke, drink etc. Preach holiness to the Christian and salvation to the sinner.
