## THE DAILY VACATION BTBLE SCFOOL

## I. THE HISTORY OF THT DAILY VACATIOI BIBL工 SCEOOL

In different histories of the Daily Vacation Bible School movenent, there appear accounts of how this or that church, back in the last century. started sone sort of week-day religious instruction, which finally crystallized into the Daily Vacation Bible School.

It seems that it was really many schools, rather than just one, that led up to the novement that we know today.

All kinds of classes have helped to introduce this work. Some of these were held for just one day each week, others were held for several nights consecutively; and still othets were held for a week at a time。

The very first Vacation Bible School is perhaps the one held under the auspices of the wirst Church of Boston ${ }^{\text {in }}$ in the year of 1866.

The next Vacation Bible School nentioned in the History of this work, was held in the year 1877 in Montreal, Canada, under the auspices of the "International Association of Daily Vacation Bible Schools ". This school hela a program very much as we do today, with its songs, Scripture readings, stories, drilis and manual work.

Froi these very early dates showing the birth tine of this type of work, we realize just how slow we have been in catching the vision of Bible work for chilaren during their vacation ti efroin school.
II. THE REASONS FOR EAVING A DAIIY VACATION BIBLE SCHOOZ

I-It is a way to win and hold new children for the Sunday School.
2-Sunday School instruction of the Mord of God is not enough.
3 The Homes and Eublic Schools neglect to train the children in religious matters.
4-The Church of tozorrow depends upon these children and their knowledge of religious matters.
5-It is a way to win children to Christ, who would not enter a church otherwise.
6 -It is a way of contacting new homes, who would not allow their children to come to Sunday School otherwise.
III. WHO SHOULD BE TMPFRESTED IN THE DAIIY VACATION BIBLE SCTOOL?

1-Whe Pastor of the Church should, of all people, be the most interested in what goes on in his church. So he should be the first one to be consulted. The Pastor should really be the first one to see the need for a Daily Vacation Bible School in his church.

2-The Church officers or members of the "Official Board" should also be very interested in having a Daily Vacation Bible School in their church. They should see and feel the real need of the Daily Vacation Bible Schools. For the "official board" can make or break the D.V.B.S. if they choose.

3-The Sunday School board of officials should see and feel the need of the Daily Vacation Bible School. Because the Sunday School and the Daily Vacation Bible School works hand in hand. The D.V.B.S. will
add to the numbers on the S.S. attendance rolls, if the D.V.B.S. is carried on in the correct way.

4-The Church Congregation of people should feel the need of the D.V.B.S., because their work will be to encourage the parents of chilldren to let the boys and girls attend the School. They must also have the desire to see that their own children are up in the mornings and that they come to D.V.B.S.

5-The Boys and Girls of the Church and Sunday School should be so interested and excited over the idea of having the D.T.B.S. that they will do most of the advertising for the School.

## IV. WHAT IS THE DAILY VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL?

1. It is one division of the Sunday School.
2. It is held during the summer months when there is no School.
3. It usually continues two, three or four weeks in "me.
4. It is held every day between the hours of $9 \mathrm{~A} . \mathrm{M}$. and $120^{\circ}-$ clock noon.
5. It has four departments----namely

Beginner, Primary, Junior and Intermediate. The School may also have a Cradle Roll department men the need arises. The ages of these departments are--Beginners 4 and 5 years, Primary 6, 7 and 8 years, Juniors 9,10 and 11 years, and the Intermediates who are 12,13 and 14 years. If a Cradle Roll class is held, it should be children under the age of four years, and only children who can walk should be admitted to a Cradio Roll class of tho D.V.B.S.
6. The children are taught according to departments. The classes can be quite large.
7. The pupils nay have and use textbooks, but this is not noessary.
8. The teacher uses a Teacher's textbook.
9. One general room is needed for the opening and closing of the D.V.B.S.

Also a space or room is needed where each of the departments may moet for their class work.
10. The D.V.B.S. should be free to the children who choose to come. The cost of the School may be met by the Church paying the expense, or by a special offering being taken to moet this need. Tho children should be given a chance to give an offering each day, but it is best to mako this a missionary offering, which will bo explained in later lessons.

HOW SHOULD A CHURCH GET STARTED IN THIS D.T.B.S. YORK?

1. One person is needed who has a vision for this work. Hazy ideas are not enough. One person must have the vision. By this we mean they must know what a D.V.B.S. is, what it is for, how it should be carried on, how to carry it on, and all about it. Any one can be this person, because there is plenty of written material on the subject so that any person living may study and become enlightened upon the subject without too much effort.
2. A good place is needed in which to hold the School. Usually the School should be held in the Church building. Although many times the Church building is nuch too small and other plans must be made. In this case nany tirnes it is possible to rent one of the School rooms or School portables. We should strive to get the very best place that we can for our D.V.B.S.
3. It must be decided just what tine of day will be the best for the D.V.B.S. Sone prefer to have it in the morning from 9 until $120^{\prime}$ clock. This is the best time for the children are not so tired then and they learn quicker. Others prefer to have it in the afternoon. Perhaps another Church is holding its D.T.B.S. in the morning, and in order to get more children it would be wise to hold the D.V.B.S. in the afternoon. The School should not be held too late in the afternoon.
4. Next, the length of time that the School will continue must be decided upon. Then irst starting a D.V. $\overline{\text { B.s. }}$ do not try to have a lengthy school. It is best to hold the School for two weeks or four weeks. One and three weeks seem incomplete.
5. Make plans for financing the D.V.B.S. Plan with the Church board for the church to finance the D.V.B.S. or take up an offering to finance the D.V.B.S.
6. The faculty must bo selectod noxt. By the faculty we mean a teachor for cach department, a pianist, and a leader's holpor. Helpers may also be selocted for each departmont.

Each teacher must be selected with care. They should wisely be fitted to each class and ago that they must teach. They should have a real love for tho age that they are to teach. The pianist should bc one that plays without too many frills. Their time should be perfect, and they must also have a love for children and much patience. The Leader's holper may be a young person, Intormediate or Senior. In any caso they must fit into the place they are to work. In large D.V.B.Schools department superintendonts must be chosen. Their responsibility is the departnent. They must sec that it runs syoothly and in perfoct order.
7. Proper Matorial for each class must bo found. This will take much timo of scarching. Evon after good teacher's books have been bought, the leader must go through the books and decide just how nuch of the matorial given shall be used.

A Bible story must be chosen for each day for each dopartment.
Bible Story Guestions should be planned for each day for each departmont.

Notebook work must be plannod for cach day for cach department.
Momory work must be planned for each day for each dopartment.
Songs must be found for each dopartment, and a portion of each song must be planned for each day.

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And last, but by all means not the least will be plaming the handwork. Most books ao not give handwork that will take hone the Gospel story. The handwork should point to the Gospel story and in this way it will become a means of salvation to sone one.
8. Each of the subjects must be timed for each department or class. Following is a time chart used in one of the D.V.B. Schools last year.

9. The Leader nust meet with the Teachers in training classes. It is best to meet with the teachers of each department at soparate times. Ireet with the Cradle Roll teacher and helpers two or three different times. Talk over every day's work so that the teachor undorstands evory part of it. These teachers
meetings should continue as long as there is something to teach the teacher and helper.

Meet with the Beginner class teachers next and their helpers. Give then plenty of your time and help. Then meet with the Prinary teachers and next with the Junior and last with the Intermediate teachers. This takes a great deal of time. But it will be well worth your time. After the School has started the teachers will understand just what they are expected to do, then the leader will have more time to relax.
10. Rewards must be planned. There are daily rewards to be given to the children in the closing time of each day. These rewards should be inexpensive and yet beautiful and well worth workins hard for.
A reward should be given for the one in each class that can retell the Biblo Story the best. A reward should be given to the one in cach class that can repeat the Nenory Text the best.
Also a reward should be given at the ond of each day to the one in each class that has bost behaved.
Many other rewards can bo given. Those rewards oncourage the children to do botter work.
Each teacher must first decide the different things that they will give rewards for, and thon maku the rowards for each day. Each days' rewards should be placed in an envelope with the date and day that they are to be used, printed on the outside.

Following are a fow patterns for those badge rewards to be given at the end of each day. The difforent dopartmonts may have different patterns for their badges. This will make them much nore intorosting. Do not send those rewards homo oach day, but keop them in a prominont placo until tho last day of School.


Following will bo found anothor type of reward for tho daily work. Jach child will recoive their name and a ribbon attachod. The first tine that thoy rocoive a rowerd they will roceive the large symbol with a small one attachod. Reward for knowing tho Bible story will be a largo Biblo first with a tiny Biblo attach od. Each day thoy receive this roward they will have another small Biblo addod to this Bible Story Bible. The reward for Bible Story Questions will be small crosses added to this same large Bible. The reward for Note Book York will be a large notebook with hearts addod each tine they roceive this roward. For Menory Vork they will recoive a large star with small stars addod each time they roceivo this roward. For Songs a large Note will bo added with small notos added eoch time thoy roceive this reward. Hang theso ribbons in a conspicuous place where all can see then grow.

Daily work rewards cont.
11. Programs should be planned for each week. The first week's program should be hela on Friday of the Airst week. Classes should be shortened \& little and the last houl should be given for this progrem along with giving out the rewarcs. This first week program shoula not be too long, but should have the work fron the first weels that will be used in the last and final progran. Parents are not invited to this first progran. The children entertain themselves alone. In this way they practice for the final program b: having a real progran for then $\rightarrow$ selves. This will be discussed later in these lessons.
12. The children should be roninded continually concerning the fina? progran, which will be held on the last night of the D.V.B.S.

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The parents will be invited to this program by invitation. Teachers should let the children know each day just what portion of the day's work will be used in the final program. Then also, the teacher should practice with the children each day the pieces, scriptures, etc. that will be used in this final program. In this way the program is already to be given when the D.V.B.S. ends.
13. Large rewards should be given to the children at the last program. Bibles and Testaments are the very best rewards that can be given. But in some cases the children have already received a nice Bible and a testament in years past.

Bible Story Books are also fine gifts for this last reward.
There are other Christian Story Books that make good rewards, but the teacher should read each of these books and be sure that it is the best reading material before she decides to give it to a child for a reward.

If your Vacation Bible School is small, in the summer of 1945 use Beginner Book I, Primary Book 3, Junior Book 3, and Intermediate Book 3. In the year 1946 use--Beginner Book 2, Primary Book I, Primary Book 2, Junior Book I, and Intermediate Book 3.

From this outline you can figure just which book to use for any year, by renembering that Beginners have book I, book 2 then book I and book 2, again. The Primaries, Juniors and Intermediates have book I, book 2 and then book 3, after which they repeat--book 1 , book 2 and book 3, again. This repetition continues throughout the years.

If your Vacation Bible School is large you should have a class for each age and use the correct book for that age as listed above. It is necessary to have eleven classes and Teachers if this method is used. There will be twelve classes and Teachers when the Cradle Roll Class is included.

Order one Teacher and one Pupil Book for each class, and be sure to order these books early so thore will be no delay in your plans.

on pago 16 you will find a Curriculum. This will give a different TIME SCHEDULE than I have given on our lesson sheets, page 4. These lesson shects will use the TIIE SCHEDULE found on page 4, rather than the one found in the book. Use the one that you profer.

Pages 17-23 in the Beginner Book I explains the subjects to be used with Book I. The subjects of the book are a little different from the ones used on these lesson sheets.

Following is an outline for Beginner Book $l$ to be used with the Time Schedule found on page 4 of theso lesson sheets.

The following outline is for a two weeks Vacation Bible School course.

Each Beginner Teacher should receive a typewritten copy of the following outline, a Boginner Teacher's Book I and a Beginner Pupil's Book I.

Cut the first page of the Beginner Workbook from light blue paper. Cut tan colored mountains, the deep blue sea, the green grass, the tree, trunk, bushes, and flowers from colored paper. The children will paste these pieces into place during class time left for the workbooks.

The Teacher will say "I am thinking of something that God made, and I can see it now". She should look at the thing that she is thinking about. The children guess what it is, and when a child has guessed right, it can take a turn at thinking and looking at something. The child that gets the most turns will win. A piece of candy should be given as a reward.

## VII-HANDHORK

Use the FIOWER POSTER Figure 7 in the Beginner Book I.
Cut the background sheet from light blue, the bowl from yellow, the leaves from green and the tulips from two shades of pink paper. The children will paste the bowl, the leaves and flowers into place on the pale blue background. Punch two holes in the top and put a ribbon in the top with which to hang the poster on the wall.

Lesson 4 Handwork is pasted on the back of the tan colored sheet 2. The cloud is cut from white construction paper, and the little city should be cut from gold paper. This gold paper may be bought at any book or paper store. Cut the cloud open, so that the little city may be inserted into place. Just paste the city along the botton edge so that it will stand out a ways from the cloud.

## VI-GAME

Have the children form a circle out of doors. When the teacher calls "HEAVEN" the children all jump up in the air, and reach their hands toward the sky as high as they can, when the Teacher calls "Earth" the children let their arms and hands fall toward the earth and they droop their bodies toward the earth also. The idea of the game is to catch the children off guard so that they will do the wrong thing and then they have to stand in the center of the circle and they are out of the game. The child that always does what is told them gets the reward for the day, a piece of candy.
VII-HANDWORK
Buy blue blotting paper from any book storo or paper store.

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Cut the blotting paper the size of the pattern below. Draw the pattern of the clouds on the blotting paper. The children should stick cotton on the space for clouds, this will give a real cloud effect. A little gold city should be pasted on the space for the city. When ribbons are added at the top, this will make a lovely gift for then to give to Mother or Fathor when they receive it at the close of the school.


Print the verse, "I was glad whon they said unto me, let us go into the house of the Lord" Psalm 122:1" at the bottom of the blotter.

The Handwork and bookwork should be displayed during the whole time of the Vacation Bible School. It is best to display it in the main room, as it creates an interest that nothing else will be able to do.

To bring a missionary idea into the game, call the blindfolded one the missionary, and they are trying to catch heathen for Christ.

The Handwork is taken from the picture on page 43. The background is cut from light blue, cut the whole figure of the girl from tan paper, cut the hair out of black, the head piece fron red, the blouse from blue, the sash fromyetiow, the apple from red and the skirt from orange. The chifdren will paste these all into place, and the teacher should add a acalendar pad in the upper left hand corner.

Divide the class into two sides, then the race begins. One child from each side will race to the other side and back, then they will bring a child from their side with them and race to the other side again. This time they will stay on the opposite side and the second child goes back and brings some one across. The first side to be on the other side wins. The small diagram below will help the teacher to understand the game. The numbers represent the children in the order chat they race.


The arrows show the way the children run back and forward. No. I child must go over and back alone before taking any one over. Then No. 1 takes No. 2 over and No. 1 stays on the other side, and No. 3 cones back to take No. 4 across and stays on the other side. Then No. 4 must go back again even though there are no more children. No. 4 must go back to the other side and return to stay on the opposite side and this finishes the race.

The Teacher should bring out the idea that the children cannot go across alone. If there are only three or four children in the class, then it is best to not try to divided the class into two sides, but to play from one side according to the above diagram.

## VII-HAND:HORK

On page 133 of the Primary Vacation Bible School Book III you will find directions for making plaque. The directions tell how to make a picture plaque, but we will make a child's hand plaque which will be a little different.

Small paper plates with fluted edges make a good mold for the plaques. Mix Plaster of Paris with water in a clean tin can. The water must be placed in the can first, then put the Plaster of Paris into the water. You must remember this, because if the water is added to the Plaster of Paris the mixture will not harden. Mix the Plaster of Paris until. like a thick cream. It will take about a cup of Plaster of Paris for a sinall paper plate mold plaque.

Pour quickly into the dish molds and have the child press its hand print into the upper flat service of the Plaster of Paris. It drys very quickly and therefore you must work very fast. The child's hand should be greased a little so that it will not stick to the Plaster of Paris. The paper mold should be greased also before using.

If a little rinsing dye or paint is mixed with the water before it is mixed with the Plaster of Paris, then the whole plaque will have a tinted shade.

It is best if the teacher helps one child at a time to make their plaques, while the rest of the children watch. The Teacher's helper could mix the Plaster of Paris for the next child, while the teacher helps one child make the impression of their hand in the plaque. The Teacher must renember that when the Plaster of Paris has been mixed to the quality of thick cream, it must be used imnediately. It will harden $\therefore 1$ left a minute too long.

After the plaques have hardened the toacher can paint "I WILI NELP OTHERS" at the top of the plaque, or the small cut letters then may be bought in packages nay be used andupasted into place at the top of the plaque.
