DEBATE & SPEECH TEAM RANK HIGH: SCHOLARSHIP AVAILABLE

As of January 1 Northwest College ranked 8th in the state (out of 25 schools in the Northwest) in debate. For the first time NC ranked 49th out of all colleges and universities <u>in the nation</u> who are members of the Cross Examination Debate Association (more than 200 schools). At the Western Washington University tournament on the weekend of February 4-6, James Carson and Israel Kloss won first place in Novice division of Parliamentary debate. Roger Altizer was rated second best speaker (out of 22) and Sara Hudson was rated fourth best speaker of parliamentary debate, Championship division. Roger also won second place in Junior Impromptu, competing against 26 other students in 3 rounds and a final. He was a finalist in Prose Interpretive reading. Lise Lovoll won second place in Junior Poetry and second place in Championship Dramatic reading. She was a finalist in Prose and a finalist in Championship Poetry.

At the Willamette University Tournament on January 27-29 Roger was ranked second best speaker in Junior Parliamentary debate and Troy Baxter was ranked fifth best speaker out of 36 other competitors. Troy was a finalist in Impromptu, Roger was a finalist in Prose and Programmed Oral Interpretation and Lise was a finalist in Prose and Programmed Oral Interpretation. The next tournament is qualifications for nationals on March 11-12 at Linfield College.

FOUR \$600 SCHOLARSHIPS are available to debaters for next year. To qualify, students must have a 3.0 GPA, be willing to do extensive research and contribute to an evidence pool, attend all practice meetings and tournaments. See Prof. Gillespie for an application.


