# **GIVING THROUGH YOUR WILL**

#### **Types of Bequest Forms**

"I give, devise and bequeath to Northwest College (percent )of my estate to be used by its directors and administration in carrying out its corporate objectives and purposes."

#### OR

"I give, devise and bequeath to Northwest College the sum of \$ to be used by its directors and administration in carrying out its corporate objectives and purposes."

#### OR

"All the residue of my estate, including real and personal property, I give, devise and bequeath to Northwest College."

(These forms are suggestions only. Legal forms should always be prepared by your attorney.)

# **TUITION BANK**

The Tuition Bank is a pre-payment plan which permits students, parents, grandparents or friends to purchase tuition credits at current prices. The tuition credits are held in the bank until the designated student enrolls in college. At that time the tuition credits are surrendered as full payment for tuition on a credit for credit basis with no additional tuition costs.

classroom. She had spent many hours in the classroom before her student teaching and professors like Donna Blue and Teresa Stoops had helped her to become a good classroom manager.

One of Tricia's fondest memories was when she told her classroom that she and Travis were expecting a baby. The whole

# NORTHWEST CROSS COUNTRY RUNNERS PLACE AT NATIONALS

n only the second season of Cross-Country at Northwest College we qualified two women to the NCCAA National Championships. Amy Ross (Junior from Anchor-

age, Alaska) and Kim Maher (Freshman from Puyallup, Washington) represented Northwest College well at the November 11th track meet at John Bryan State Park in Cedarville, Ohio. Despite terrible weather conditions, Amy and Kim rose to the occasion with 12th and 14th place finishes. The top 15 finishers in the nation receive All-American status. Congratulations to Amy Ross and Kim Maher!

We are now working hard on recruiting for next year's men's and women's teams. On the women's side, with Kim and Amy returning, we need to find three to five quality runners to try to qualify a full team to nationals. On the men's side we are a little further behind; however that can change in one season. We are looking for men and women who love to run and want to use their running talent as a ministry.

# GODSPELL - NORTHWEST'S FIRST PRODUCTION OF A BROADWAY MUSICAL

A team of talented students participated in NC's first production of a Broadway musical when Dramatic Arts/Drama Club staged John-Michael Tebelak and Steven Schwartz's *Godspell* in November. With ten cast members (nine students and one staff member) and a production ministry crew of almost 20 students, *Godspell* utilized the multi-faceted gifts of NC students in its presentation of the Gospel of Matthew through various styles of music and drama.

Almost 350 theater-goers from at least three states experienced the message and person of Christ over the



four-night performance run. The powerful and often humorous development of relationships with Jesus and demonstrations of parables kept the audience laughing as they learned. They sat in silence and sometimes tearful tension as they witnessed the ripping betrayal of one of Jesus' own and the moving crucifixion and resurrection. The audience included many who do not know Jesus. A cast member gave an invitation to respond to the Gospel each night.

"Godspell provided NC with an unusual opportunity to develop students spiritually, intellectually and in performance skills, all while reaching out to our community," says director Debbie Lamm. "In all regards, it was a successful venture. I count it a rich blessing to have worked with such fine people on a ministry production of this quality."

# NEW DEGREE COMPLETION PROGRAM Leadership Education for Adult Professionals (LEAP)

The LEAP Degree Completion Program is an exciting and practical program of study designed for adults who have completed two or more years of college and are looking for a way to complete their degrees. LEAP is designed to minimize the scheduling demands which most often conflict with work and family life of those enrolled in a traditional program. It maintains the academic standards of Northwest College while providing small group identity, personal instruction and work-related research. Students will be challenged to develop their critical thinking, problem-solving and decision-making skills while applying classroom learning to the real world of experience and practice. The courses will be taught by experienced professors who appreciate the ideas and opinions that are brought to the classroom. Learning is an exciting, lifelong journey and this program gives those individuals who feel they "just don't have the time" an opportunity to achieve this significant milestone in their life.



## Program Overview

Northwest College has developed its LEAP (Leadership Education for Adult Professionals) Degree Completion Program to meet the educational needs of men and women who:

- Want to complete their degree through evening classes.
- Have completed at least two years of college.
- · Are at least 25 years of age.
- Are highly motivated to finish their degree.
- Can schedule their time carefully and discipline themselves to meet the rigorous demands of this program.
- Want to complete their degree in a Christian setting where the faculty and staff are sincerely interested in the student and his or her future.
- Are working full-time and/or have a busy home life.

# Program Benefits

Students in this program will be able to:

- Complete the major for their bachelor's degree in approximately 18 months.
- Convert significant work experiences into college credits by documenting past training, work-related projects and learning.
- Attend class only one evening each week, thus minimizing interference with work schedules and family life.
- Improve communication and other management skills, strengthening their position in the job market.
- Meet in a seminar format and benefit from the varied experiences and ideas of other classmates.
- Attend small classes with the same students for all sessions, developing group cohesiveness and an active network of associates.
- Receive individualized instruction and specific attention to problem areas.
  Complete a bachelor of arts degree with a major in Organizational Management.
- Graduate with an accredited degree and be eligible to enter graduate school.
- Gain satisfaction from fulfilling an educational goal.

# Information Sessions

Throughout the year, Northwest College holds information sessions on campus and at other locations to inform prospective students and employers about this program. These sessions cover:

- The nature of the accelerated LEAP Degree Completion Program.
- Meeting the needs of the adult student.

- · Other questions and answers .



Did You Know... That the president of Northwest College is committed to motivating young people to obtain a quality education in this biblically based, Pentecostal environment, not just to secure a good job, (if "good job" is defined in terms of income – the higher the income, the better the job, or as a means of "getting ahead", or a "passport to privilege"), but as an initiation into service.

The purpose of Christian education, regardless of the subject or discipline, is the equipping of the saints for ministry.




# Did YOU KNOW?

- that Northwest College is now in its 62nd year of uninterrupted ministry as an Assemblies of God institution of higher learning?
- that the enrollment for the fall of 1995 was 824?
- that our current students, through their tuition and general fees, pay a little less than 72 percent of the total operational budget?
- that of our 824 churches in this region, 110 are supporting the College through their World Ministries giving? (These churches, by state, are listed separately)



- that the College received \$226,827 in direct support from churches and our Districts including direct church scholarships to students?
- that the College is owned by our supporting Districts in this region and is controlled by a 31 person Board of Directors?
- that the Northwest College Foundation exists to secure, receive and administer planned gifts of money, real estate, tangible and intangible property on behalf of the College, and has a 31 member Board of Trustees?
- that the Northwest College Foundation is managing funds in a variety of trusts and assets totaling \$2,599,661?
- that history clearly shows that colleges remain biblically sound when denominations remain strong in the support of those institutions?
- that the Mission Statement of Northwest College continues to guide every decision made?
- that all faculty are hired by the Board of Directors through the recommendation of the Interim Personnel Committee, which includes the president, a district superintendent, two other district officers, and two other members-at-large?
- that the College is operating this current year on an \$8,490,203 budget?
- that the majority of ministers serving our churches in this region are graduates of Northwest College?
- that at the semi-annual meeting of the Board of Directors the tuition, room, and board rates for 1996-97 were established? (The cost of full-time tuition was increased by \$305 per semester)
- that strategic planning is in progress for VISION 2020, which includes the renegotiation of our master plan, which is in progress?
- that Northwest College, according to Peterson's Guide to Colleges, has the lowest cost (tuition, fees, room, and board) of any private liberal arts college in this region?

- that students are the number one priority at Northwest College?
- that there are 252 students enrolled in the Division of Religious and Ministerial Studies, and a great number of students in other majors whose motivation is to be involved in ministry?
- that 67 percent (551) of our students are from the Assemblies of God?
- that our students come from 24 different states and from 15 other countries?
- that Northwest College employs 261 people as faculty, administrators, staff and student workers?
- that several NC faculty and students took a missions trip to Romania?
- that NC students helped 100 seniors clean their homes and yards this fall?
- that we gave over \$1,900,080 in College and Federal Government scholarships and grants were given to students last year?
- that we are presently in the process of campus-wide computerization? Over \$292,000 is to be spent to link faculty, staff, and residence halls to the library and the Internet.
- that we have been approved by the accrediting association to begin our degree completion program in Organizational Management for people who have completed two years of college and are at least 25 years of age?
- that Northwest College is preparing students to be world-changers? Tom Sine in his recent book *Wild Hope* writes, "Frankly, much of Christian higher education seems devoted to preparing the Christian young to fit into this present world, not to change it. Many Christian schools seem to be preparing the young to fit into middle-class professions and life-styles, rather than involving them in a vision that can turn our world upsidedown." Our goal is to motivate students to live above what our culture defines as success.




## NORTHWEST COLLEGE ENROLLMENT STATISTICS






# COMBINED GIVING

Our combined giving for 1994-95 was recorded at \$705,225. Giving to the general fund comprised 26 percent of the total; the Target 2000 fund, 17 percent; the Endowment Fund, 30 percent; scholarship and tuition aid, 25 percent; and the Capital Campaign, 2 percent. We are thankful to God for those who are helping to support our students. Our total church and district support for this past year was \$226,827.

# FOUNDATION

The Northwest College Foundation (Founder's Fund) is holding approximately \$11,491,103 in trust which includes endowed scholarships, charitable remainder trusts, and annuities. Besides the earnings that went to Beneficiaries, the earnings from the Foundation this past year for direct student/college support were \$156,269.

# INDIVIDUAL GIVING

Our College Advancement Office reports that we now have nearly 400 participants in our Target 2000 program, which includes five in the President's Circle (those who contribute \$5,000 or more annually), 56 Centurions (at least \$1,000 annually), 20 Partners (at least \$500 annually), 76 Target 2000 members (at least \$120 annually) and an additional 243 PLEF members (Prayer and Living Endowment Fellowship). Total 1994-95 giving to the annual fund is reported at \$98,512.

# STUDENT AID

Our students (for the 1994-95 academic year) received \$4,964,094 in aid. Of that amount \$3,051,672 was in government loans, while \$1,912,422 came through scholarships and grants. At the beginning of 1990, the Board set as a goal that by the year 2000, 20 percent of the tuition revenue would be designated toward scholarships. This next budget year we will be at 17 percent. We have been able to keep on target and are slightly ahead in accomplishing our goal.

## CONTRIBUTING CHURCH ORGANIZATIONS

The following church organizations have demonstrated their commitment to Northwest College during the past year by their financial contributions. # "ON SITE DINOSAUR DIG BEING OFFERED AS A COLLEGE CLASS"

r. Bill Randolph will be teaching an on site paleontology class in Wyoming. The class will take place at a dig site rich in fish, clam, and dinosaur fossils. Students will experience all that is involved in an archeological dig, including excavation at the site. Randolph, a long time professor at Northwest College, approaches the class as a creationist.

# The class will take place at a dig site rich in fish, clam, and dinosaur fossils.

Participants should be in good physical condition as the site is at 4400 feet elevation. The weather is typically hot, arid, and temperamental (last year the group experienced cloudbursts and 70 mile an hour winds).

Participants will provide their own transportation to Newcastle, Wyoming, approximately 1200 miles from Seattle. Sessions will start with arrival on site either June 16th or 23rd to get established in camp. Instruction begins the next day and goes through Friday. Camp will be vacated on Saturday morning.

## Fees

There are three possible packages: NOTE: The FACT fee includes all meals, digging equipment, camp site, and general supervision.

## 1. Participation through Northwest College for college credit.

Fees are: 2 credits at summer school rate = \$526 (new students add \$12.50) (\$150 of the FACT fee will be paid from this). Total cost for 2 credits would be the FACT fee of \$595 (if reserved by April 1st, add \$100 if after) less \$150 (paid to FACT from tuition) plus \$526 for a total of \$971 (travel is additional).

A third credit, requiring the stay of a second week, would cost \$256.75 for tuition, a small additional fee from FACT for food, personal needs for the Saturday and Sunday when FACT does not provide food, and whatever travel and personal expenses may be incurred.

## 2. Participation through Northwest College for teacher credential clock hours.

Clock hour charges would be the FACT fees and a fee to Northwest College of \$200. Clock hours for the one week field activities would be forty unless the heat or weather is prohibitive. A second week might be arranged for one or two individuals who would assist, under supervision, with directing some of the activities and curriculum development, Second week expenses would be an additional fee of \$100 to Northwest College, a small additional fee to FACT for food, personal needs for the

Saturday and Sunday when FACT does not provide food, and whatever travel and personal expenses may be incurred.

## 3. Participation through FACT, no credit or clock hours.

FACT charges \$595 per week if a \$100 non-refundable deposit is sent by April 1st. The fee is \$695 if reservation is made later. (NOTE: The site is open from June 16 to August 17 with family camps, other colleges, general weeks and half weeks. If dates other than June 16 through 26 interest you, contact Dr. Randolph.)

Students will experience all that is involved in an archeological dig, including excavation at the site.

# SEATTLE SEAHAWKS SAFETY, EUGENE ROBINSON, SPEAKS DURING NC CHAPEL

He walked into the chapel carrying his Bible and a saxophone. Those who were in chapel that day found out that Eugene Robinson knew how to use them both. **Imprint:** How did you become a Christian?

**Robinson:** In 1984, I was a junior at Colgate. I broke my leg in the spring so I had lots of time to sit around and think. I started thinking there was more to life than school and football. I went to church with a friend and suddenly realized that my lifestyle offended God. I asked Christ into my life to forgive my sins.

Imprint: What do you want to do after the NFL?

**Robinson:** My major is in Computer Science, but I have a feeling that I will probably end up working with young people in some kind of ministry.

**Imprint:** What is your greatest football moment?

**Robinson:** It would probably be winning the division championship with the Seahawks in 1988.

**Imprint:** Is Northwest College a good place to have your training facilities?

**Robinson:** I have a saying, and that is "A little light will do."
