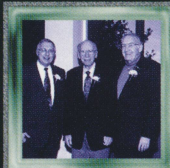

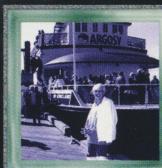

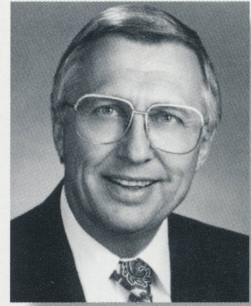

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

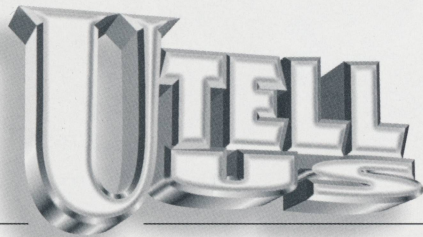
PRESIDENT

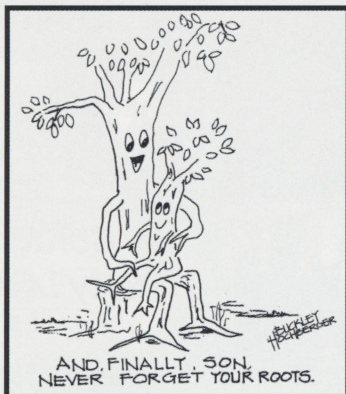

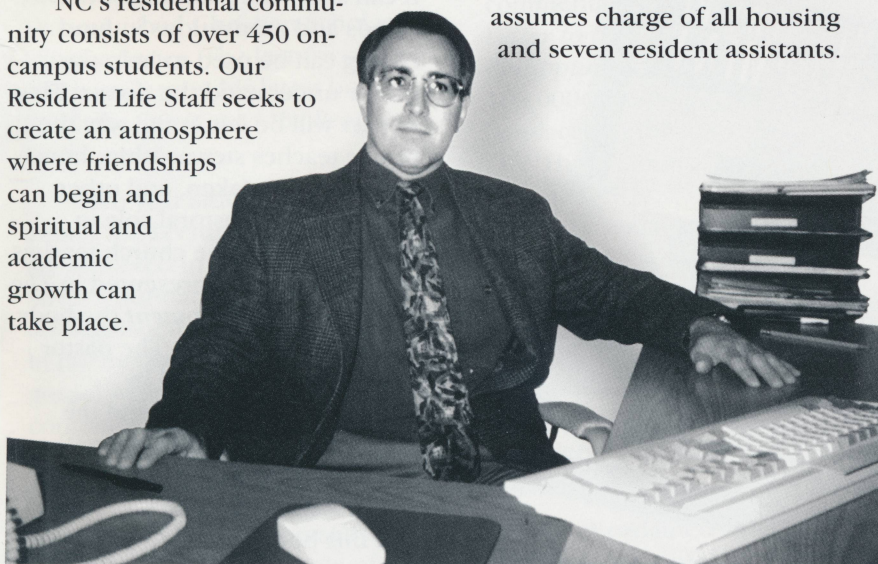

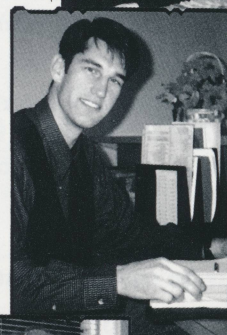

The Ministry Of Development

John Frank has been working with Northwest College for the past two years as a consultant for the "Forward in Faith" Capital Campaign. John is a Certified Fund Raising Executive with an MA in Philanthropy and Development from St. Mary's University. John recently published a book titled *The Ministry of Development* (1996, EDM Press). In October '96, John gave an insightful presentation to the Northwest College Foundation Board who recommended his book be sent to all pastors. In this interview John Frank offers some of his insight concerning stewardship, development, and the college.

What is "development", and how can this be called ministry?

I define "development" as creating opportunities to connect God's people to God's work. The goal of development is to connect people, through the giving of their prayers, time, and treasure, to the front lines of the ministry. I see this as an opportunity to draw people closer to the ministry in which their lives will be enriched.

In your book you say, "The benefit in giving always goes to the giver." Could you please elaborate on this?

What I have found in scripture is God's emphasis on the giver. Very seldom is it on the organization. We see in Philippians 4:17 that God watches what we give. The giver benefits in a number of ways:

They know they are being obedient. They know they have made an impact. As a result of their giving, God takes care of their needs.

With so many needs, how should people prioritize their giving?

First, giving must be to the local church. Additional giving is between the giver and the Lord. You can't give to everything. What things touch my heart? Is it Christian education, foreign missions, feeding the hungry, a crisis pregnancy center? Ask the Lord to show you. Each family should sit down and ask the Lord where they should give.

Many people feel they are always being asked to give. How would you respond to these people?

First I would say that people should never give out of guilt. The question must also be asked, "What is your understanding of stewardship?" The average giving per American household in 1995 was 1.9%. People are not giving sacrificially. They give out of discretionary income. People need to say, "we must go without so we can give when the Lord leads us." When people understand biblical stewardship, they can filter each appeal and determine if it fits with their priorities.

Do you feel that Christian higher education is a valid place to give?

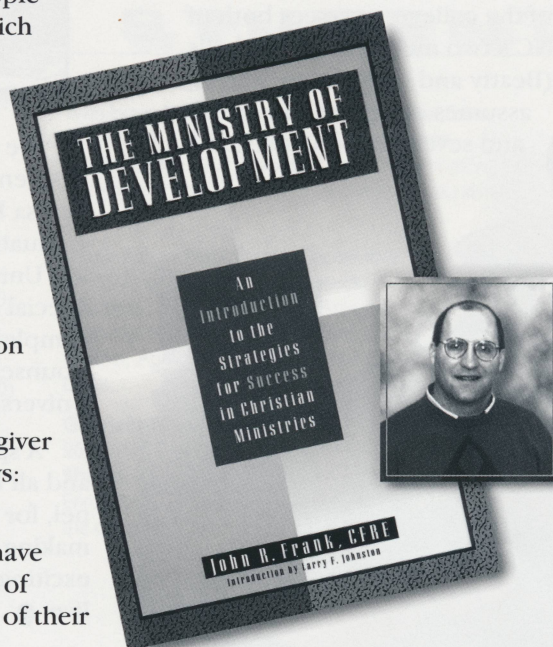
Many educational institutions ask for funds. These appeals are philanthropically based; (philanthropy is the love of mankind). Christian higher education has loftier goals. If one believes that God has His hand on the organization and that the organization is shaping the future leadership of our churches and families as they fulfill the Great Commission, then giving to Christian higher education is valid and important.

Can you briefly explain the difference between the "Forward in Faith" Capital Campaign and the Annual Fund at Northwest College?

The difference is in motivation. The Annual Fund touches the lives of students today. Giving to the Annual Fund says, "I believe in what God is doing in the lives of students and faculty today, especially this year." The capital campaign looks at touching lives for generations through new buildings. I believe one needs to give for today, and also invest for the future.

How does your book impact the local church?

It can show the pastor how the trends and motivations in fund raising can be used to help the pastor understand the donor. This impact will be felt in the way the pastor teaches stewardship, how the offering is taken, and other aspects of the pastoral role in stewardship. As the church teaches the fundamentals presented in *The Ministry of Development* the body of Christ will benefit. The pastor will not be threatened by parachurch ministries, and the entire body can function together. As one pastor on the Foundation Board said, "I wish I would have had this book forty years ago!"



A Life Of Integrity

Webster's Dictionary defines integrity as "completeness, wholeness, and honesty." These words easily apply to new Centurion members, John and Maud Ulsund. Last summer John was rummaging through some old papers. Hidden in an envelope he found a certificate for a charter membership in the Living Endowment Fund signed by former President C.E. Butterfield. Even though John and Maud have given to NC in the past, John knew he had not met his PLEF (Prayer and Living Endowment Fund) commitment. Recently, John and Maud contacted the College Advancement Office and fulfilled their commitment by becoming Centurions for 1996/97.

John's career has been in construction, and the Biblical foundation he received at Northwest has laid the foundation of honesty and integrity for his entire life. The Ulsunds have faithfully supported their church first and other ministries, such as Northwest College, second. God has blessed their faithfulness. In giving to Northwest, they understand that the students, regardless of major, are receiving a quality Christian education that will help them become leaders with integrity.

Dr. Fee – Staley Distinguished Christian Lecturer

Dr. Gordon D. Fee, Professor of the New Testament at Regent College, Vancouver, BC, where he also serves as Dean of the Faculty, recently delivered the Fall Staley Distinguished Christian Scholar Lecture Series. The lecture series was based upon his latest book, *Paul, the Spirit, and the People of God*.

Each year students and faculty attend the Lecture Program. They are indebted to the Thomas F. Staley Foundation for providing distinguished scholars who believe in the message of the Christian gospel in its historical fullness as a contemporary, relevant, and meaningful message.

During Dr. Fee's visit, he delivered an evening presentation on "The Bible and the Role of

Women in the Church."

A special lecture and reception was held commemorating Dr. Fee's newest commentary, *Paul's Letter to the Philippians* as the 100,000th volume to be placed in the D.V. Hurst Library. The lecture focused upon "Preaching Themes from the book of Philippians." Friends, alumni, and area pastors celebrated this memorable occasion. A brief program of dedication and a reception honoring Dr. and Mrs. Fee closed the activities of the day.

As an ordained minister with the Assemblies of God, Dr. Gordon

Fee has become well known for his concern for the renewal of the church. His heart and mind were directed toward this objective in the presentations.

As one faculty member observed, "His ministry was spiritually enriching and challenging to me. I genuinely was blessed and convicted. He called me to more intense fervor in my relationship with God."

Sending a child off to college is the dream of most parents and grandparents. Your daughter, son, or grandchild will have invested thirteen years in academic preparation. How many years will you have to prepare financially?

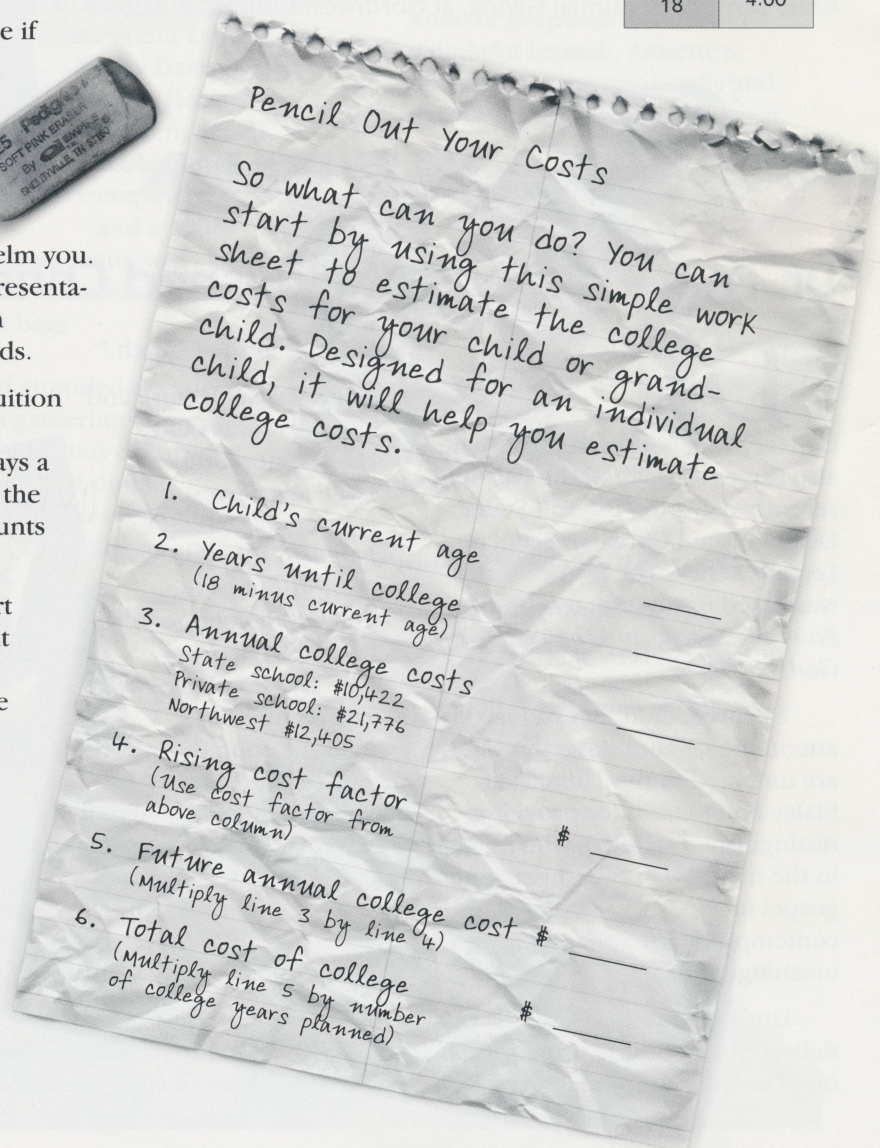
You have eighteen years to accumulate money for tuition. Unfortunately, college costs keep rising. For example, the average annual cost at a public college (tuition, room and board) is currently \$10,422, and a private college, \$21,776. In the year 2014, it is predicted that these numbers will increase to \$41,688 and \$87,104, respectively. If these projections are accurate, the current NC cost for tuition, room and board (\$12,405) will increase to \$49,620.

Now what? First, determine if your savings and investments put you within reach of the estimated tuition, room, and board costs. If so, you are in good shape, if not, do not let the numbers overwhelm you. Talk to your investment representative who can map out a plan geared to meeting your needs.

It is best to start your tuition fund when a child is born. Systematic investing is always a good choice and gives you the opportunity to work with affordable amounts of money.

A lump sum investment can jump start a tuition account. A parent or grandparent can give a child up to \$10,000 a year without triggering the federal gift tax. One option may be to invest lump sums into a Uniform Gifts to Minors Act account which offers tax advantages as the account grows. Many strategies and tactics can aid you in funding and multiplying your savings in this important project.

FROM THE PRESIDENT

I find myself immersed in the life and ministry of Northwest College in our sixty-third year of existence and my seventh year as president. I was delighted to have represented the College at the missions convention of Seattle's Calvary Temple, the founding church of NC. Those people possessed a great vision that has become a reality. Sixty-one missionaries listed in the convention's missionary prayer bulletin were NC alumni.

The mission of NC has never changed and clearly states:

The mission of NC is to provide an evangelical Christian environment with quality education to prepare students for service and leadership.

The college experience should:

- 1. Develop the whole person through general studies integrated with biblical knowledge.*
- 2. Include professional and vocational skills in the student's preparation for service in the world.*
- 3. Help to fulfill the Great Commission and to propagate the continuing faith of the sponsoring church.*

At Northwest College you will find...

...quality, committed and dedicated **students**. I am impressed with the students who are growing among us. Our freshman class came in with an average high school GPA of 3.3.

...a **library** that now contains over 100,000 volumes with one of the largest collections of theology volumes in the area. Other institutions, such as Fuller Regent, and Northwest School of Ministry, also value NC's collection, and students from those schools regularly secure access to our library.

...thirty-nine full-time **faculty** members and forty-two adjuncts who are committed to excellence in the classroom, live as Christ-like models for the students, and take the time to individually meet the needs of their students.

...a new adult degree completion program, **Leadership Education for Adult Professionals (LEAP)**, which permits adults who have two years of college experience to complete their baccalaureate degree in 18 months. We are anticipating by the end of this academic year to have over 100 people enrolled in this program.

...an **athletic program** with eight intercollegiate sports and membership in NAIA.

...a **Teacher Education Program** which includes two years of field experience in teaching and produces many of the finest classroom teachers anywhere.

...a **Church Ministries** curriculum designed for the twenty-first century church. The curriculum is grounded in our resident faculty as well as six adjunct professors who are currently involved in practical church ministry.

...a place where students can find **jobs** in great supply. We currently employ 120 students on campus. Community businesses eagerly offer our students a variety of jobs.


...**residence halls** that are being remodeled and refurbished with computer access for the students on our campus-wide network and Internet.

...an atmosphere where God can speak to all of us, and **chapel** services every day where the entire community comes together in worship and to hear the Word of God.

There are a multitude of other things you will find, BUT...

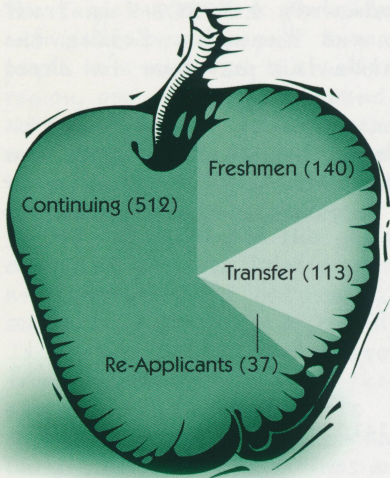
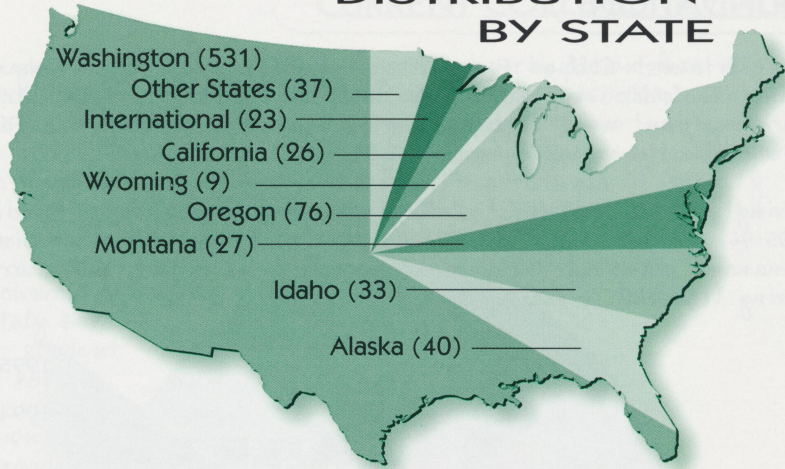

ENROLLMENT BY DIVISION & MAJOR

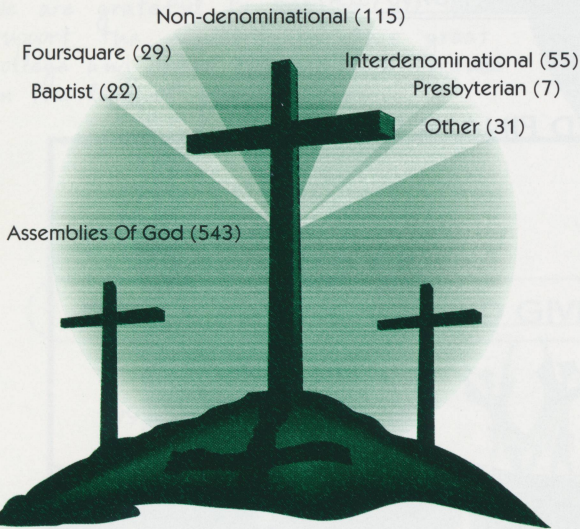

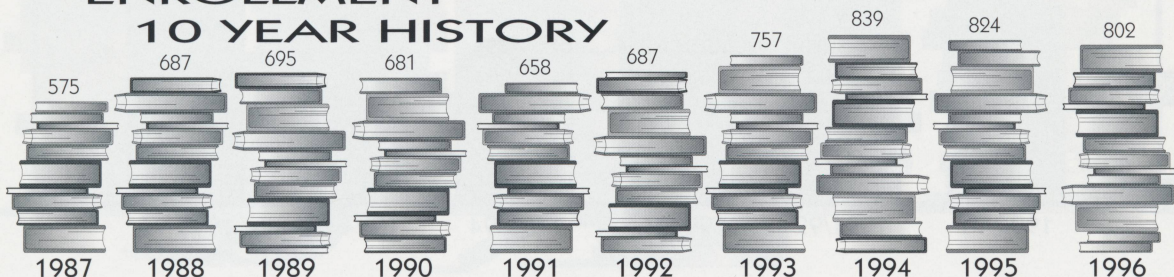

ENROLLMENT 10 YEAR HISTORY

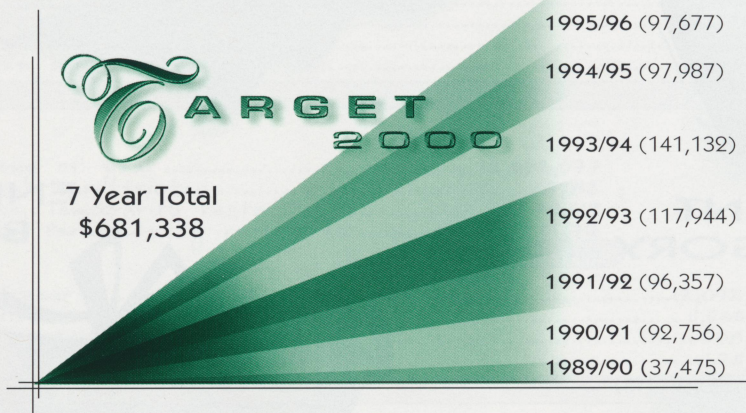

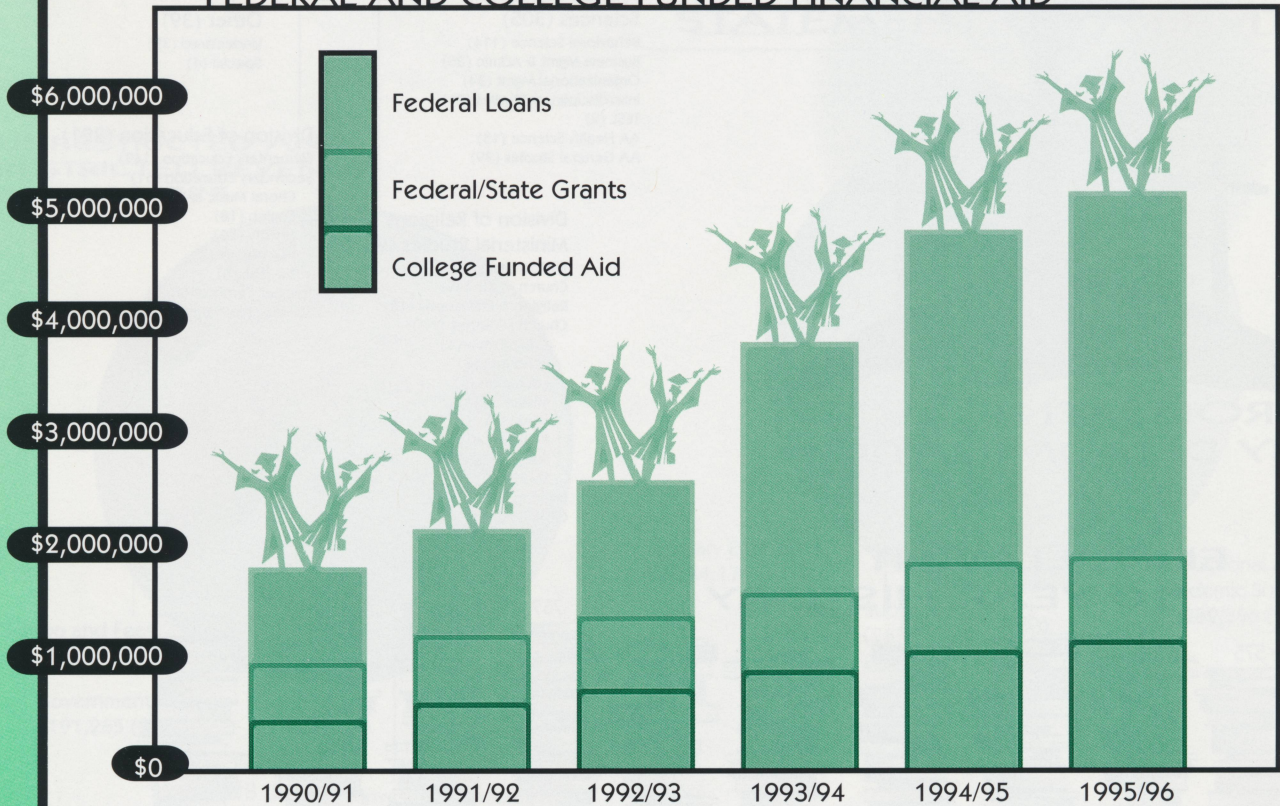
FOUNDATION

The Northwest College Foundation (Founder's Fund) is holding approximately \$ 11,735,945 in trust which includes endowed scholarships, charitable remainder trusts and annuities. Besides the earnings that went to beneficiaries, the earnings from the Foundation this past year for direct student/college support were \$ 200,048.

Giving to the Northwest College Foundation Founder's Fund totaled \$816,905 for fiscal year 1995-96. We are again thankful for those individuals who include Northwest College in their financial planning through wills, trusts, annuities, and current resources. Endowed scholarship giving (\$105,451) is included in the Founder's Fund total.



FEDERAL AND COLLEGE FUNDED FINANCIAL AID



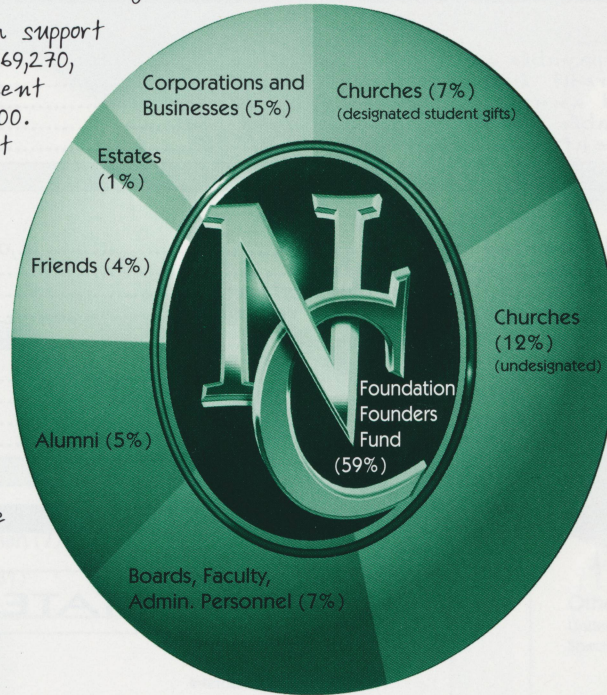

CURRENT COLLEGE GIVING

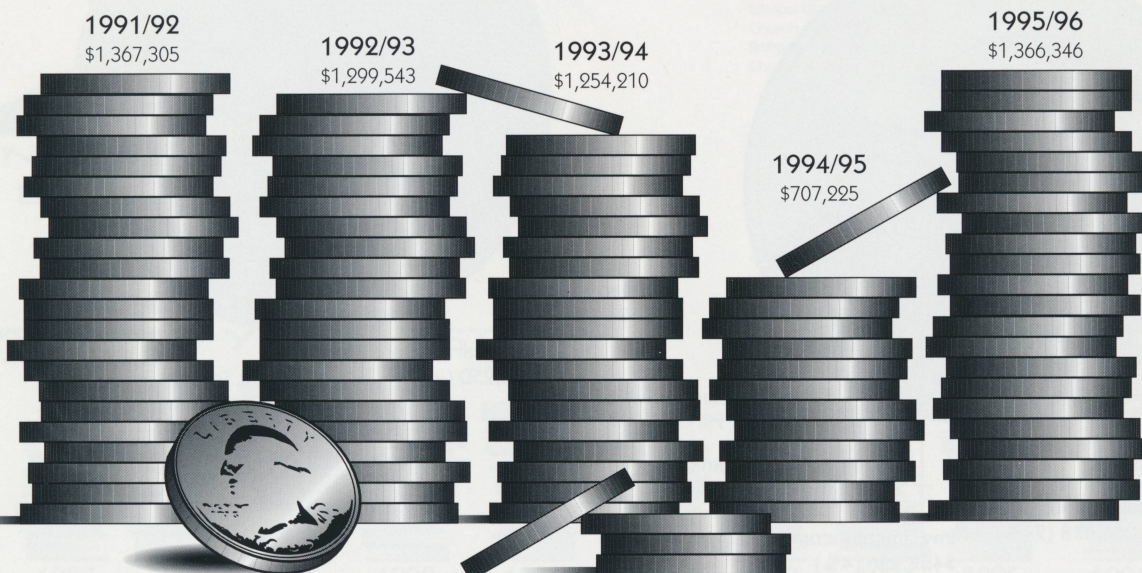
The Target 2000 Task Force (launched in April of 1989) has demonstrated participation from 1039 individuals over the past 7 years who have contributed a total of approximately \$681,000. These people have captured the vision of Christian higher education for young people in our northwest region, our nation and around the world. Through their established giving, they have allowed Northwest College to make academic and spiritual advancements for the assistance of faculty and students beyond the college services provided by tuition dollars. Total giving to the Target 2000 Annual Fund for the 1995-96 fiscal year totaled \$97,677.

We are thankful for the general church support during 1995-96 which totaled approximately \$169,270, and church gifts designated for student scholarships totaling approximately \$89,000. It is my belief that general support from churches throughout the region is essential. The college exists to provide not only pastors and missionaries, but Christian leaders whose lives are firmly established in biblical principles. Ultimately, these young people will enter into many facets of church ministry, regardless of their chosen profession.

We are grateful to God for all who support the ministry of this great college and desire to make a difference in the lives of young people.

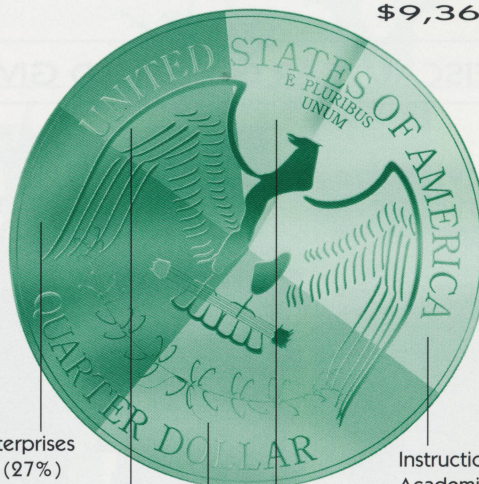

Flying Colors: Debaters Soar at Air Force Academy

How does the academic quality of Northwest College compare to that of other colleges and universities? One way to judge is by looking at how our students perform at intercollegiate debate tournaments. Three recent contests prove that NC ranks with some of the best institutions in the nation.

Two of NC's students were judged Best Parliamentary Debate Speakers at the prestigious 38th annual US Air Force Academy Forensics Tournament. More than sixty debaters from twenty-two colleges and universities competed at the three-day event on the Air Force Academy's campus in Colorado Springs, Colorado.

NC's Ryan Doughty won first place for speaking ability, and Jacob Witt was judged as second best speaker. Jacob serves as captain of the eleven member debate squad. In addition to being rated for speaking ability, teams were given wins or losses for each round. Topics were assigned fifteen minutes before rounds and covered

current events and political philosophy. On Sunday, the Witt-Doughty team reached the first of four elimination final rounds after completing six preliminary rounds on Saturday. Both lost on a two-to-one decision of the three judges. Northwest debated in opposition to the topic "This house

believes that imagination is the only weapon against reality."

Ryan and Jacob reached final rounds at the Lewis and Clark College debate tournament held in Portland, Oregon. In the last round, Northwest debated in opposition to the topic: "This house supports assisted suicide." Twenty four schools competed, including the University of Washington, Rice University, and Southern Texas University.


The debaters dominated the field at the Lower Columbia College tournament where sixteen schools competed. After six preliminary debate rounds and two final rounds, the senior team of Jacob and Ryan won First Place Senior Division competing against twelve other teams. Members of the Junior Division Team, Sarah Busie, and AmyJoy Munson, won First Place Junior Division competing against fourteen other junior teams. Both teams debated affirmative for the topic "This house believes that Miranda rights favor the guilty." NC won second place sweepstakes for the tournament.

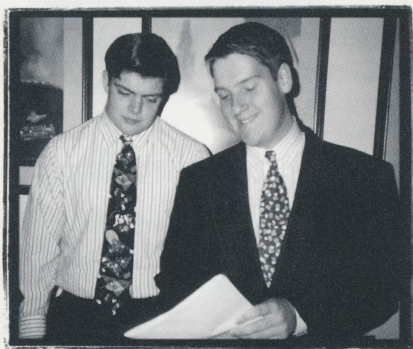
Jacob and Ryan won Third Place Senior Debate, out of 32 teams, at the 64th Annual Linfield College Tournament in

McMinnville, Oregon. In the semi-final round, NC debated affirmative on the topic "This house believes that the First Amendment is out of date." Twenty nine schools attended, making Linfield one of the largest meets in the country. In addition, both novice teams made finals. Jay

Anderson and Jeremy Kowalski won an Octo-Finalist Award (top 16), and Josh Brittingham and Doug Lloyd won a Quarter Finalist Award (top 8), competing against thirty four novice teams.

Recent honors follow last year's successful season when NC was ranked 20th in the nation for total points in the National Parliamentary Debate Association. Last March, Ryan and Jacob attended the National Tournament held at Rice University in Houston, Texas where Ryan and a former partner reached final rounds. This was the second time NC had made finals at the Nationals. Ryan's total winning points from last season placed him among the top ten students in the All-Conference Team in our division of the Northwest Forensics Conference.

Other team members include: Carissa Dore', Kim Cassell, Jeremy Kowalski, Lydia Homan and Louise Wall. Adjunct Professor Kingston Wall serves as assistant and judge. Former University of New Mexico debater and Education Director for Human Life of Washington, Camille DeBlasi, also judges and assists the team.

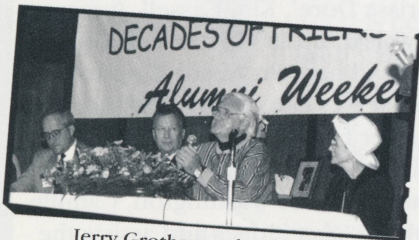

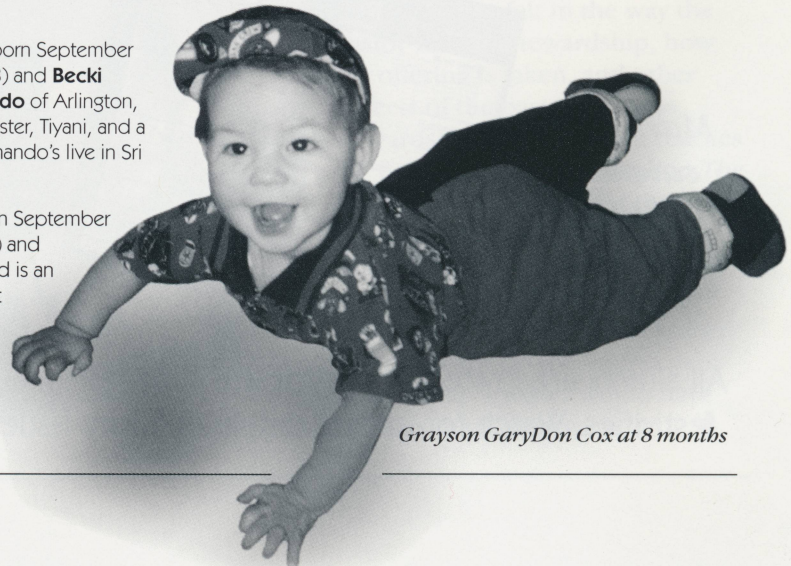
