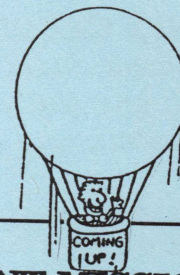

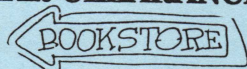
PLEASE BE REMINDED that NC policy requires that "all tuition fee, long distance phone charges, rent, and room and board charges must be paid in full in order to take finals."

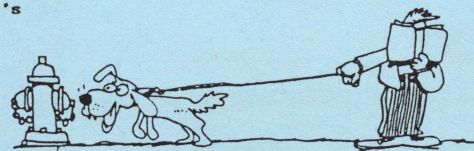
