

Dr. Robert Rhoden prepared for pastoral leadership at Toccoa Falls Bible College where he obtained his Bachelor of Arts degree in Bible in 1963. Entering the ministry, he spent the next two years serving as an associate with David Wilkerson, founder of Teen Challenge, in New York City.

In 1965, Robert Rhoden became an Assistant Pastor. While serving in this capacity, he attended Elizabethtown College and graduated with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Philosophy and Religion in 1966. During this time he met Joan Elaine Hershman, and they were married on January 22, 1966.

To continue his education, the Rhodens moved to Wheaton, Illinois, where Robert Rhoden earned a Master of Arts degree in New Testament Studies from Wheaton College. In 1982, he earned his Doctor of Ministry degree from Union Theological Seminary of Virginia. He is currently a featured speaker at conferences, seminars, workshops and special meetings.

To serve as the Superintendent of the Potomac District of the Assemblies of God, Dr. Rhoden resigned as Pastor of the West End Assembly of God, Richmond, Virginia, on July 28, 1991. In his current capacity, he oversees 300 plus churches and 800 credentialled ministers, serves as President of the Board of Trustees of Valley Forge Christian College, and is a General Presbyter for the General Council of the Assemblies of God.

The Rhodens have three grown children: Julie, Rob and Cindy, and one grandson, Brennan.

RECOGNITIONS AND AWARDS

SIGMA CHI PI

Sigma Chi Pi is an honor society established for graduates of endorsed Assemblies of God Colleges. The name of the honor society, Sigma Chi Pi, means "Diligent Christian Leaders," taken from Romans 12: 8 "...one who leads, with diligence." The faculty of Northwest College choose their selections from graduates and alumni exhibiting outstanding academic scholarship, approved Christian character and recognizable achievement in leadership, service, or vocation. Fourteen graduates and three alumni will be honored during this Sixty-Second Commencement service.

Alumni Honorees

Eva Radanovsky was a member of the second graduating class in 1938. She served as pastor in Goldendale and in Medical Lake until 1944. Ms. Radanovsky left the pastorate to go to the Missionary Health Institute in Toronto, Canada, from which she graduated in 1945. Immediately, she departed for Haiti as an Assemblies of God Missionary nurse.

After service in Haiti, Ms. Radanovsky studied linguistics at the Hartford Seminary Foundation in preparation for a new assignment in Burkina Faso, West Africa. During her missionary career in West Africa, she served as a Bible School teacher, nurse, and Bible translator. Upon returning to the U.S., Ms. Radanovsky has volunteered as a hospice nurse wherever needed in the Spokane area.

William Randolph entered Northwest College in 1958 as a new Christian. Those initial three years had a profound impact on his life as he observed the faculty and their deep commitment to Christlikeness. It became his prayer that God would allow him to be a part of a program that would help others establish their faith in Christ.

Mr. Randolph transferred from Northwest College to work toward his bachelor's degree at Cascade College. He graduated in 1964 and began his teaching career. In 1967, Mr. Randolph joined the faculty of Northwest College. By 1971, he had completed the Master of Education degree from Seattle Pacific University. It was in 1988, that Professor Randolph chose to return to Northwest College as a student to complete his second Bachelor of Arts degree. Mr. Randolph was awarded the Doctor of Education degree in 1992 from Washington State University.

Dr. Randolph has been instrumental in establishing the Applied Science Center at Northwest College. Under the auspices of the Center, he has led teams of students to Mexico, Romania and Zambia to apply eco-intensive science methods for life-sustaining purposes. This non-traditional approach to fulfilling the Great Commission has been a value that has motivated Dr. Randolph throughout his thirty-one years of faculty leadership at Northwest College. Dr. Randolph holds the rank of Professor of Life Sciences.

Robert Stone, a graduate of the Class of 1968, has served in pastoral leadership at Assemblies of God churches in Poulsbo, Wenatchee, Spokane, Seattle and Bellingham, Washington. During the last 20 years, he has been the senior pastor of Hillcrest Chapel, in Bellingham, a church which has grown from 125 parishioners to over 1,400 in weekly attendance.

Pastor Stone completed the Master of Arts degree in 1980, from the California Graduate School of Theology. He chose to pursue a Doctor of Ministry degree at the Western Conservative Baptist Seminary and graduated in 1985.

Dr. Stone has served as a mentor to over 150 people who have entered the vocational ministry or missionary service. He was founding pastor of Calvary Chapel, Seattle, from which outreach ministry to the University of Washington has continued to this day. For the past nine years, he has been a Presbyter for the Northwest District Council.

DELTA TAU FACULTY HONOR AWARD

The Delta Tau Faculty Honor Award presents an opportunity for the College Faculty to recognize noteworthy contributions of services and resources to the development of Northwest College and its educational objectives. The recipients will have had a sustained relationship to the college, whether on a formal or informal basis.

DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD

The Distinguished Service Award is presented for outstanding service to Northwest College, for the manifestation of exemplary Christian character, and for loyal support of the College. This recognition is made by the Board of Directors.

PRESIDENT'S AWARD

The President's Award is given in recognition of significant service and contribution to Northwest College, to the community, or to the public welfare of humankind. The award is made at the discretion of the President and the Board of Directors.

HONORS AT GRADUATION

The academic degrees may be conferred with honors on the basis of the student's grade point average at Northwest College. These honors are shown at graduation by a colored cord worn draped around the neck of the graduate. The honors levels are:

Highest Academic Honors

Academic honors are presented to graduates who have achieved the highest grade point averages on all work done at Northwest College toward graduation. The 1998 honorees are:

THE PAGEANTRY OF ACADEMIC REGALIA

The traditional academic attire originated in the middle ages. It began as the regular garb of scholars, whether cleric or lay. In the unheated buildings and lecture halls of the day, the robes, hoods and caps were very practical wear.

The GOWN, whether it developed from clerical or civilian dress, was useful outerwear. In addition, it provided a uniform dress that served to equalize class and wealth distinctions in the community of scholars.

Today, in the United States, the gown is customarily black, though it may be one of the colors of the school (especially of universities following a European model). The wearing of the gown open or closed, the sleeve style, and added trim serve to distinguish the degree levels of the wearers. Bachelor gowns are very simple and are worn closed, while masters' gowns are frequently worn open at the front, sometimes with the arms exposed below the elbows. The doctoral gown commonly has trim down the front and three velvet bars on the sleeves, in black or in the color of the degree field. The sleeve is bell shaped, close-fitting at the wrist.

The HOOD originated as a practical head covering. In modern times it is strictly decorative and ceremonial. The hood is commonly worn by those holding master's or doctoral degrees and differs in length according to the degree (three and one-half feet, and four feet). The hoods are lined with the colors of the conferring institution, and trimmed with an edging (of three inches or five inches width) in the color of the degree field. The act of "hooding" is part of the traditional ceremony of conferral of advanced degrees.

The "Oxford" CAP or MORTARBOARD possibly developed as a ceremonial combination of a close fitting indoor cap and a soft square-topped academic cap for outdoor wear. (Some schools use a type of beret or tam for doctoral degrees.) The cap is topped by a button holding a tassel which may be black or the color of the degree field (gold for a doctoral degree in some schools.)

The tassel is customarily worn on the left by degree holders, thus the bachelor's degree candidates wear the tassel on the right until the symbolic "moving of the tassel" at a climactic point in the graduation ceremony.

The College MACE is the symbol of authority of the faculty and is carried in the Commencement Processional by the official representative of the faculty, the Faculty Marshal. The central emblem of the mace is the SEAL of the College which embodies the history, character and purpose of the College. The College Seal pictured on the cover of the Graduation Program contains nine elements: the legal name of the institution; its year of founding; the shield of faith; the centrality of the cross; the lamp of learning; the open Bible; the small cross and crown denoting the temporal and eternal aspects of the Christian life; and underlying the crest is a ribbon on which is inscribed the first words of the COLLEGE ALMA MATER, "let light shine out."
