Admiral, U.S. Navy (Retired); Chief of Naval Operations (2000-2005)

Admiral Vernon Clark completed a distinguished 37 year Navy career in 2005. He was Chief of Naval Operations serving from July 21, 2000 to July 22, 2005, making his tenure of five years the second-longest serving chief. Admiral Clark was born in Sioux City, Iowa. He graduated from Evangel University and earned a Master of Business Administration degree from the University of Arkansas. Admiral Clark's personal decorations include the Defense Distinguished Service Medal, Navy Distinguished Service Medal, Defense Meritorious Service Medal, and Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal.

He is on the Board of Directors at Raytheon Company and Rolls Royce North America. He is a visiting professor in the schools of Government and Leadership at Regent University. Admiral Clark and his wife, Connie, live in Phoenix, Arizona.

Recognitions and Honors

Sigma Chi Pi

Sigma Chi Pi is an honor society established for graduates of endorsed Assemblies of God colleges and universities. The name of the honor society, Sigma Chi Pi, comes from the Greek words meaning "Diligent Christian Leaders," taken from Romans 12:8, "one who leads, with diligence." Alumni Honorees

JoAnn Smith is a 1976 graduate of Northwest University. She received her license to preach that same year. JoAnn's calling to minister to the deaf led her to Chi Alpha Campus Ministry at the National Technical Institute for the Deaf, then to a National Home Missionary/Campus Chaplain appointment at Gallaudet University, where she served for ten years, witnessing growth to over two hundred students. She completed her master's degree in Cross-Cultural Communications in 1981 and her doctoral degree in Organizational Leadership at Regent University in 2004. She is a faculty member at North Central University and the Senior Pastor of Pleasant View Deaf Assembly. She and her husband have two deaf sons adopted from Estonia. She has taught deaf programs in Sweden, Ukrainia, and Estonia.

Jason Streubel is a 1996 graduate of Northwest University, with a degree in Missions. A second bachelor's degree in Environmental Science from Northwest and a master's in Agriculture from Washington State University continued his preparation. His heart for missions and teaching has taken him to Mexico, South Korea, Sri Lanka, Nigeria and other countries. He served as Associate Pastor in Bellingham and Smokey Point, and is now Senior Pastor at River of Life Community Church in Van Zandt, Wash. He is awaiting acceptance into a Ph.D. program in Non-Profit Management and hopes to work in Africa, feeding the hungry and sharing the gospel. Jason is a volunteer firefighter and Whatcom County Support Officer. He also serves on two school district communities, and is an elected county official. Jason is married to Mary (Clark). They have two sons, Macuen and Joash.

The Pageantry of Academic Regalia

The traditional academic attire originated in the middle ages. It began as the regular garb of scholars, whether cleric or lay. In the unheated buildings and lecture halls of the day, the robes, hoods and caps were very practical wear.

The GOWN, whether it developed from clerical or civilian dress, was useful outerwear. In addition, it provided a uniform dress that served to equalize class and wealth distinctions in the community of scholars.

Today, in the United States, the gown is customarily black, though it may be one of the colors of the school (especially of universities following a European model). The wearing of the gown open or closed, the sleeve style, and added trim serve to distinguish the degree levels of the wearers. Bachelor gowns are very simple and are worn closed, while masters' gowns are frequently worn open at the front, sometimes with the arms exposed below the elbows. The doctoral gown commonly has trim down the front and three velvet bars on the sleeves, in black or in the color of the degree field. The sleeve is bell shaped, close-fitting at the wrist.

The HOOD originated as a practical head covering. In modern times it is strictly decorative and ceremonial. The hood is commonly worn by those holding master's or doctoral degrees and differs in length according to the degree (three and one-half feet, and four feet). The hoods are lined with the colors of the conferring institution, and trimmed with an edging (of three inches or five inches width) in the color of the degree field. The act of "hooding" is part of the traditional ceremony of conferral of advanced degrees.

The "Oxford" CAP or MORTARBOARD possibly developed as a ceremonial combination of a close fitting indoor cap and a soft square-topped academic cap for outdoor wear. (Some schools use a type of beret or tam for doctoral degrees.) The cap is topped by a button holding a tassel which may be black or the color of the degree field (gold for a doctoral degree in some schools).

The TASSEL is customarily worn on the left by degree holders, thus the bachelor's degree candidates wear the tassel on the right until the symbolic "moving of the tassel" at a 3climactic point in the graduation ceremony.

The MACE is the symbol of authority of the faculty and is carried in the Commencement Processional by the official representative of the faculty, the Faculty Marshal. The central emblem of the mace is the University seal.

The SEAL embodies the history, character, and purpose of the University. In addition to the legal name of the institution, the seal includes these elements:

- An open Bible, which underscores our commitment to God's Word;
- The lamp of knowledge, which demonstrates our tradition of scholarship and the integration of faith and learning;
- A dove, which represents our reliance on the Holy Spirit's leading and power;
- A cross, which asserts the centrality of Christ in all we do;
- A braid, which illustrates the bonds of Christian fellowship;
- The year 1934, which is the year of Northwest University's founding; and
- The Latin motto, *Vocationem Dei Gerite*, is translated "carry, carry out, and be characterized by God's calling." This phrase reconfirms the University's vision statement: *Carry the Call* with heart, head and hand.

Northwest University History

Northwest University was founded by the Northwest District Council of the Assemblies of God and opened to students on October 1, 1934. The District Presbytery appointed Dr. Henry H. Ness to be the first president. Northwest was housed in the facilities of Hollywood Temple, Seattle, Washington, for the first twenty-five years of its existence. Dr. C.E. Butterfield succeeded Dr. Ness in 1949, and Dr. D.V. Hurst assumed the presidency in 1966 and served through 1990. He was succeeded by Dennis A. Davis, who served as the fourth president from 1990-98. Dr. Don Argue is the fifth president of Northwest University.


Originally known as Northwest Bible Institute, its institutional name was changed to Northwest Bible College in 1949 and to Northwest College of the Assemblies of God in 1962. In January 2005, Northwest College officially became Northwest University. Each change represents a stage in its organizational development.


Academically, the Northwest progressed from a three-year to a four-year curriculum in 1948, and in 1955, a liberal arts division was organized. With university status has come the granting of both undergraduate and graduate degrees. A major milestone of academic development and progress was the achievement of regional accreditation by the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities.

In 1958, Northwest secured a new thirty-five acre campus in Kirkland, in the greater metropolitan area of Seattle. Since then 21 more acres have been added to make the present fifty-six acre campus. Located at 108th Avenue NE and NE 53rd Street, just ten miles from downtown Seattle, the campus is an ideal setting for study, recreation, and inspiration. The campus is also near to area corporations, resulting in employment opportunities for students and alumni.

In May, 1992, Northwest University became the eighty-fifth college approved for membership in the Council for Christian Colleges and Universities, an association of one hundred and five Christ-centered colleges and universities of the liberal arts and sciences.

Over the years, the University's alumni have engaged in full-time Christian service in professional, business, or vocational occupations in fulfillment of Northwest University's vision statement to *Carry the Call* with heart, head and hand.
