MINISTERING TO PERSONS IN LIFE THREATENING ILLNESS

"Come Walk With Me"

Why you as a pastor must be there, not just some other professional. What is your role, how do you carry it out, and the various contributions that you as a pastor make, that no one else can make.

"Three Faces of Death"

Psychological, sociological, and spiritual dynamics taking place in the lives of the patient and families of the patients involved in a life threatening illness.

"Language of the Patient Facing a Life Threatening Illness"

Deals with the act of listening and what you as a pastor can communicate to the patient and family.

"The Family is a Patient Also"

Deals with the needs, problems, pain, etc. of spouse, children, and their interaction, and how this affects them. Their interaction with patients Ways to minimize these problems and minister to these needs.

"The Healing of Human Hurts"

Working with specific problems: Denial, anger, depression, guilt, anxiety, sexual, etc. "The Therapeutic Use of Scripture"

A section dealing with the tremendous problems of pain, suffering, grief, questions, etc., and what the Scripture has to say about many of these problems and how to communicate it, in and through healing ways.

"Legal, Ethical and Moral Issues"

Those points which confront staff, family, and patient facing a Life Threatening Illness.
