\*Double occupancy, 14 meals per week. Single and multiple occupancy plans are available on a limited basis. 20 and 7 meal per week plans are also available.

A \$100 tuition deposit becomes a credit on the account, but is forfeited if the student does not attend and fails to give written notice by published deadlines.

A \$200 residence hall deposit is retained as long as the student is registered to return. Fifty percent of the deposit is forfeited if the student withdraws mid-semester.

## Payment Plan

Accounts are due and payable in full on the first day of classes. However, an interest-free, **Monthly Payment Plan** is available, subject to a setup charge of only \$85 per year. The plan is administered by a third-party. Annual charges are divided into 10 equal installments commencing June 2001. See the payment plan flyer or the College Catalog for complete terms.

- Don't wait; apply for financial aid now.
- Students need to be accepted for admission before financial aid is processed.
- Applicants who submit all material by March 1, 2001 will receive priority in the awarding of funds.
- Allow six weeks for processing the FAFSA and Northwest College Financial Aid Application.
- Students will receive a Financial Aid Award Letter after all requested documents have been submitted.
- All students must arrange a payment plan with the Student Accounts Office prior to the first day of classes each semester. The payment plan will be arranged in conjunction with the student's financial aid award.



## Positive Change for 2001-2002

Tuition rates for 2001-2002 now include up to 3 summer-session credits. Students will be able to choose from a variety of classes offered in several summer sessions.

College funded financial aid increased \$400,000 for 2001-2002 to \$3,090,000. In all categories, the Financial Aid Services Office will award over \$8,000,000 to Northwest College students.

An interest free, 10-payment plan in partnership with Tuition Management Services will provide an inexpensive, convenient service for a setup fee of only \$85 per year.

**Dollars&Sense** is a series of seminars that Financial Aid Services will offer students.

Additional faculty to support new and growing programs joined our community.

## A Good Investment

Total costs to students at Northwest College remain more than **25% below** the national average for private college and university education (the national average is now over \$21,000). The gap is even broader when compared to schools here on the West Coast.

College graduates earn, on average, over \$10,000 more per year than those with only "some college."
