ROBERT B. EKVALL, CHINA EXPERT

As an interpreter at international conferences he was indeed a "faithful echo" as he translated for American and Chinese diplomats. Ekvall is the author of several books, including "Faithful Echo", 1959, telling of his experiences. Ekvall served on Gen. Joseph Stillwell's staff in Burma during the Second World War. He was an intelligence officer under General Wedermeyer in Chung-king, China, shortly after the war.

Beyond his military and diplomatic credits, Ekvall was born in China. He lived there as a missionary for many years and brings to this work a feel for the Chinese that goes beyond scholarly dissertations.
