Meade, an internationally-known experimental psychologist, has spent much of his professional career traveling to obscure corners of the globe observing people, their customs and ways of life. He has written extensively about his research comparing the psychology of one people with that of another. He is equally at home with nomads in Afghanistan, monks in Nepa, Maharajas in India or in his profession as university professor. Dr. Meade now brings his observations and keen insights to the problems of Manipulation and Control in the American scene today. He shows how all of us are under seige by the brainwashers and tells what we can do to protect ourselves.
