## President Dennis A. Davis



President Dennis A. Davis has served Northwest College since 1990 as its fourth president. A 1956 graduate of Northwest College, President Davis was honored as Alumnus of the Year in 1975 and elected to the Delta Epsilon Chi Honor Society in 1976. Prior to his Presidency, he served on the Board of Directors of the College from 1982-1990 and as the Northwest College Alumni Association President from 1982 to 1987.

Reverend Davis served two pastorates before his presidency at Northwest College: Pacific Grove, California from 1961-1967; and The People's Church in Salem, Oregon from 1967-1987. He also served as the Superintendent of the Oregon District of the Assemblies of God for a three year tenure.

The College has grown significantly during President Davis' service. The former Northwest District Council Office complex and surrounding land were purchased and later occupied by the College Administration. Rice Hall was completely retrofitted as an Academic Center for the Division of Education. The College enrollment surged from the upper 600's to the current record enrollment of 861 students. Curriculum development in the Arts and Sciences and in Education has enabled the College to receive membership in the Coalition of Christian Colleges and Universities.

Mrs. Nancy Davis and their only son, Jeff, have likewise contributed their abilities to Northwest College these past eight years. Nancy has helped and befriended students, college family, and visitors alike during her hours at the front desk. Jeff has often taught evening classes. Together, the Davises have provided a wonderful example of commitment to God's purposes. We are grateful for the advances made by the College under their leadership ministry. ---Dr. Marshall Flowers

## H.O.P.E.

Hospital Outreach People Encouragement is a great ministry for those who have a heart for children and seek to encourage them and their families. Members visit hospitals and minister one-on-one through puppets, clowns, playing games, and reading stories. Places of ministry have included the Children's Hospital, Ronald McDonald House, Swedish Hospital, and other medical centers that have opened their doors to HOPE. Members of HOPE practice the week before an outing and have raised money for their equipment through car washes and other fund-raisers.


Lunch Buddies is a national program designed for kids who are labeled "at risk." Concerned employees of the community, high school and college students participate in the Lake Washington School Distrit program. Members eat lunch, play games, chat, and go to recess wth these children. They serve as mentors for kids who eagerly await their Lunch Buddy each week. Students of Northwest have had the pleasure of being a part of this program during the past year.

Lighthouse Ministries is a relationship based ministry focused on two Seattle streets: University Way and Broadway Street on Capitol Hill. Lighthouse members meet Friday and Saturday nights in the Eagle's Nest and then travel to a church on Capitol Hill for worship and to hear a challenging message from God's Word. The rest of the night they spend on the streets building relationships with homeless teens and adults or anyone hanging out on Broadway. The ministry concludes wth reflection and prayer afterwards. This group also met on Monday nights to pray together.


Voices is a children's ministry of Northwest College that reaches children between the ages of two and ten. Dressed as clowns the members perform skits, tell Bible stories, sing songs, juggle, make balloon animals, and commnicate the message of Jesus Christ.
