

Each year, these young people are chosen through an auditions program conducted by the college music department.

maintain an average or above-average G.P.A., and give evidence of musical and/or vocal abilities. And each member must be prepared to accept the extra demands of a rigorous travel schedule, in addition to their regular academic pursuits.

The 1972 King's Choralons includes young persons from the states of Oregon, Washington, Montana and Alaska. As is true in any given year, a number of the young people are leaders on campus. In the group are two ASB officers, the Associated Women Students vice-president and one basketball team member.

The King's Choralons have appeared before thousands each year in churches, auditoriums, high school assemblies, etc. Last year, the choir crossed the Atlantic to minister in Denmark, Sweden and Norway in June and July.

THE CONDUCTOR

Miss Dorothy Amundsen is a member of the music faculty at Northwest College. She has taught at the college since 1957 and has served as arranger-director of the King's Choralons since 1960. She has earned a B.A. in Education and Music at Seattle Pacific College and an M.A. at the University of Washington.

Under her very capable direction the musical ministry of the King's Choralons has become widely known throughout the Northwest. Several long-play albums featuring the choir have been produced during her tenure as director. Her Sermons in Song and the contemporary Music Dramas have been well received as unique portrayals of the gospel message.
