## **ENROLLMENT GOALS**

Serve the needs and desires of the church by:

- 1. Enrolling I000 students per year by the year 2000.
- 2. Reaching the nontraditional students by providing for their educational needs.

Serve the needs and desires of the church and the students by:

- 1. Offering enriched major academic programs in:

2. Developing programs as feasible in these major academic areas:

- 4. Graduating at least I500 students during the decade.
- 5. Adding faculty and staff to meet enrollment growth and program development.
- 6. Developing a senior ministries seminar integrating the four year academic and spiritual life experience at Northwest College. Outcome objective: A Christian Life and Ministry World View.
- 7. Expand learning resources through computerization of the library and increased holdings in support of all majors.

### **STUDENT LIFE GOALS**

Serve the needs and desires of the church and students by:

- 1. Continuing to nurture the students in their contemplation and worship of God.
- 2. Leading the students to assume responsibility as Christian citizens and to develop a servanthood commitment to God, community and country.
- Enriching the college student development services through such programs as the appointment of the pastor-in-residence and the resident assistant training.
- 4. Enhancing student activities and intramural programs.
- 5. Strengthening and expanding the intercollegiate athletic programs.
- 6. Developing advanced student leadership training.

# CAMPUS DEVELOPMENT GOALS

Serve the needs and desires of the students by:

Acquiring strategic properties for campus expansion.

Building additional married student residence units as needed.

Expanding student services in the administrative area.

Enlarging the library services by reallocating the first floor space and permitting the library to use all three floors.

Enlarging the \_ bookstore and increasing its services to students.

Building additional single student residence facilities as needed to raise the total available beds to 650.

Refurbishing the Student Center, developing the athletic field, installing the new campus entrance and constructing 30 additional married student units. Building the "Target 2000 Classroom Building" of approximately 30,000 square feet. It will include:

- Eight faculty offices
- Four classrooms seating fifty students each. Two new science laboratories (with a mini greenhouse).
- One lecture hall seating 100 students.
- A Pastoral MInistries laboratory and prayer chapel including a baptistry, wedding and funeral equipment, and audio visual equipment.
- A state-of-the-art interactive classroom accommodting from 12 up to 120 persons and equipped with audio at each student position, video for receiving and sending and interactive communications technology. It will permit receiving lectures from or sending them to other sites and even

permit simultaneous classes jointly conducted between the campus and off campus sites. It will be designed to serve the continuing education needs of the church.

Enlarging Butterfield Chapel and the cafeteria as needed.

Completing the academic quad between Hurst Library, Millard Hall, the Student Center and the Target 2000 classroom building.

Adding student recreational facilities--including enlarging the pavilion, providing a racquetball court, a weight-lifting room and additional tennis courts.

# FINANCIAL RESOURCE GOALS

Serve the needs and desires of the church and the students by:

- Expanding the Founders Fund, the long term endowment fund of the college, to \$20,000,000.
- 2. Increasing college generated student financial aid to equal 20 percent of all tuition.
- 3. Increasing designated and endowed student financial aid to equal 20 percent of all tuition.
- 4. Developing all financial aid so that students on the average pay no more than 60 percent of their tuition costs.
- 5. Endowing two faculty chairs.
- 6. Increasing the support from alumni, friends, churches, sponsoring districts and interested foundations.
- 7. Building the strategic support group of friends of Northwest College Centurions contributing a total of \$100,000 per year.

## STUDENT MINISTRY GOALS

Serve the needs and desires of the church and students by:

- 1. Appointing a full time Decade of Harvest and Student Ministries Director at the college.
- 2. Securing total student participation as prayer partners in the Decade of Harvest.
- Equipping and sending a student Decade of Harvest church planting team to each district of our region annually.
- 4. Developing a sequenced Christian service, internship, practicum and field education student ministry program integrated with the academic program and the life service goals of the students. Christian service then will have entry, intermediate and advanced levels. This will result in a personal placement file covering the academic work, Christian service and leadership development of each student.
