Aaron Gillespie @ The Vera Project (Seattle) - Oct. 29

Though he is most known more for his work as the front man of The Almost and the touring drummer of Paramore, Aaron Gillespie is coming to The Vera to show off songs from his much less rowdy studio album, "Out of the Badlands."

Phil Keaggy @ Eastside Church (Issaquah) - Nov. 4

Shawn McDonald @ Columbia City Theater (Seattle) - Nov. 17
