Please be sure to click [here](#) to read important information about cold weather plans at NU! Also, check out our winter safety driving tips:

- Most tires are considered all-season tires; if you see an M and/or S on the tire's sidewall, it is rated for Mud and/or Snow. Consider winter tires, which use unique tread patterns to better grip the road.
- Don't use cruise control in snow or ice; always be in full control of your acceleration and deceleration.
- Allow plenty of room to stop, and don't slam on the brakes. Braking gently will allow your wheels to have time to react.
- Low gears can help your vehicle maintain traction, especially when you are on hills.
- Lastly, if the conditions seem too harsh to go out in, don't go out in them.
