### STORY

"My name is Anna Tatistcheff, and I am currently a freshman from Boise, Idaho. For me, being able to attend a Christian college was an opportunity I could only dream about, seeing that many Christian universities have tuition prices that are three times the amount of my local university. So when I was accepted at NU, visited the campus, and had my parent's approval to come study here, I was living in a fantasy. But in order to pay for schooling, my parents had agreed to empty out their retirement savings to pay for the first year. Having them do this put a heavy weight of guilt on my mind, but they wouldn't budge in their decision. They were ready to give all they had in order to fulfill what they saw as God's will for my life."

"Several months after the initial decision had been made, my mother received a forwarded email from my Great Uncle George. (This email was sent to my grandmother, which was forwarded to my father, which was forwarded to my mother. A long cycle of emails.) The basis of the email was this: he was asking my grandmother how her two granddaughters were doing. (I have an older sister who is a senior in college.) When he asked if we were in college yet, my grandmother answered yes, giving the appropriate information to him. Upon hearing this, he did the most gracious thing of all. He offered to pay for all four years of my college education, giving a total of \$100,000. He did the same thing for my older sister, who will be continuing her education at graduate school. You see, my Great Uncle George inherited millions of dollars from his family upon their deaths; and at the time my close family had no knowledge of this.

"This isn't to say that everyone has a long lost relative that will randomly bless them with money for college. This is a pure example of God's faithfulness. Quite frankly, if Great Uncle George hadn't of given that support, I would have never known he existed. The only time his name might have come up would have been in his death. Which means this: what has been done in my life is a true miracle, and can happen to anyone. Anyone can receive the blessing God has for them."
