Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Do not let your heart be troubled, nor let it be fearful".

People are in need. As a matter of fact, you may be the one who is in need. Your need might be emotional, physical, or spiritual. Perhaps you feel like those in California right now, with everything around you chaotic and devastating. I want to encourage you to bring all of that to the God who loves you, who cares about what you are going through, and who is ready to bring peace, comfort and guidance to your situation.

Jesus, I pray for those who are struggling in California with the devastation and the loss that has occurred. We certainly do not understand why these things happen but we trust you today to be a source of strength to those in need. In the same way, I pray for our community, especially for those who need peace and support. Be the helper that your word promises you to be. In Jesus name, amen.
