On the other hand, I sense that anyone, including myself, is only one decision away from making a mistake. I have to remind myself that I am not judge and jury for those who made a poor choice in a moment of weakness. Theodore Roosevelt made a great statement about behavior when he said, "I care not what others think of what I do, but I care very much about what I think of what I do! That is character!" A person cannot escape the outcome of their choices.

Daniel was a great example of a politician who made good choices. Daniel was one of the top three political figures in his country. Not only was he intelligent, but he was also a person of integrity. When the ruling authorities tried to find a scandal with which to entrap, they could not find anything (Daniel 6:4). He had an "excellent spirit" and he was honest and careful (v. 4). As followers of Christ, we need God's Spirit to help us be this same way—faithful in our work, our relationships, and to God.

Jesus, too often we are weak, and we come up short of your plan for our lives. People get hurt in the process by our decisions. I pray for strength in our community to live honorably and display godly character in our decisions and actions. In Jesus name, Amen.

Students will be using a variety of artistic expressions to celebrate and reflect on the Christmas season and story of Jesus' birth. This is one of our campus' favorite events every year, and all are welcome – children, too!
