"So senior year of High school I decided to play lacrosse in the Spring and had a soccer scholarship to CSU and ended up straining all four of my ligaments in my left knee. I lost my scholarship and almost didn't go to college. I had a few pastors tell me to come to Northwest, came and checked it out and loved it so now I am here. Last year the doctors told me my knee was too unstable to ever play sports again. My heart broke and I did not know what I was going to do, soccer was a huge part of my life and I felt lost. My friend David had asked me the question "Do you have faith that God can heal your knee?" I was having a lot of trouble accepting not being able to play soccer and I was not sure what to do. With many talks with mentors and others I learned to have faith that God could heal my knee and I would be able to play again. January of this year I found out that I could play again, by the grace of God my knee was healed and I could play sports. I went and tried out for the women's soccer team here and now I am part of an amazing team and have some awesome teammates who support me. God healed my knee and all it took was a little faith to realize that what a doctor says was not part of God's plan."
