MOODY BIBLE INSTITUTE

Moody Bible Institute prepares students for vocational Christian ministry as pastors, missionaries, musicians, and other church-related workers, and as lay-leaders for local churches.

MBI's 1,450 undergraduate students choose from eleven majors including Pastoral Studies, Christian Education, Music, Missions and Communications. Each major includes intensive studies in the Bible. MBI's undergraduate school also operates a missionary aviation training program in Elizabethton, TN. Nearly half of the missionary pilots currently on the field and one in every fifteen active missionaries from North America received training at MBI.

Since its founding in 1985, the Moody Graduate School has admitted more than 600 students. Those with no Bible background work full-time toward the Master of Arts in Biblical Studies degree, preparing themselves for missions work or other types of Christian service. Graduate students currently in a ministry take modular courses throughout the year, progressing toward the Master of Arts in Ministry degree.

Founded by evangelist D.L. Moody in 1886, MBI seeks to integrate classroom knowledge with practical experience. As part of the program students obtain hands-on experience in such areas as teaching Bible classes, hospital and home visitation, and working with children and adults.

MBI also has extension schools in six states, a world-wide independent studies program, and a Christian elementary and secondary school in St. Petersburg, FL.

In addition to its educational endeavors, MBI operates Moody Press, publishers of Bibles and Christian books; *Moody* magazine and *Today In The Word* devotional guide; the film and video ministry of Moody Institute of Science; the Moody Broadcasting Network with more than 350 outlets across North America; and a conference ministry including the live Sermons From Science demonstrations, Keswick Bible Conference (St. Petersburg, FL), women's seminars, marriage seminars, and Bible and family living conferences in local churches.

THE SOLHEIM CENTER

Dedicated on January 30, 1991, the Solheim Center serves MBI as an athletic/recreational facility and urban outreach center. This 70,000 sq. ft. building includes the main gym with three full-sized basketball courts, an auxiliary gym, four racquetball courts, a swimming pool, fitness center, and a jogging track.

As an athletic facility, it is home for MBI's intramural and inter-collegiate athletic/recreational activities. Select Chicago organizations also use the building to enhance their community, athletic and educational endeavors. Several NBA teams use the center as a practice facility while in town playing the Chicago Bulls.

As a community outreach center, the facility enhances MBI's 105-year old hands-on approach to education. MBI education includes a practical application of classroom learning through involvement in local organizations. This places Moody students in 110 city agencies and 424 Chicago area churches. Students' activities include inner-city tutoring and participation in a Big Brother/Big Sister program in one of Chicago's largest low-income housing projects. The Solheim Center serves as a commonground location as MBI students develop on-going relationships with inner-city youth. Other programs such as MBI sponsored summer sports camps and clinics also extend MBI's outreach beyond the classroom.

The Solheim Center was paid for by individuals, organizations and foundations interested in MBI's neighborhood outreach programs, with major funding coming from the Karsten and Louise Solheim family, manufacturers of Ping golf clubs and materials for the aerospace industry.

1990 NCCAA NATIONAL TOURNAMENT SUMMARY

THURSDAY

Sixth seed and Missouri Regional champion Central Bible of Springfield, Mo., overcame an 83-76 deficit with 2:31 left in regulation to edge third seed and East Regional champion Baptist Bible of Clarks Summit, Pa., for a second straight year in the first round, 97-94 in overtime.

In the second game of the afternoon session, second seed and North Central Regional champion Maranatha Baptist Bible of Watertown, Wis., trailed 45-27 with 4:10 left in the first half before fighting back to nip seventh seed and South Regional champion Southeastern Assemblies of God of Lakeland, Fla., 97-92 in overtime.

At night, top seed and Pacific Southwest Regional champion Pacific Christian of Fullerton, Calif., fell behind 7-0 before coasting to a 57-27 halftime lead and a 112-79 victory over eighth seed and Pacific Northwest Regional champion Northwest College of the Assemblies of God of Kirkland, Wash.

Then fifth seed and Midwest Regional champion Kentucky Christian used a 20-8 run midway through the second half to down fourth seed and Southwest Regional champion Jimmy Swaggart Bible in the first round for a third consecutive year, 98-87.

FRIDAY

In the consolation round, Baptist Bible, Pa., scored 12 unanswered points to open up a 29-13 lead on its way to a 101-85 victory over Southeastern.

Then Mike Draughon sank a tournament-record 17 free throws and scored 31 points to help Jimmy Swaggart Bible past Northwest Assemblies of God, 105-98.

In the semifinals, Maranatha Baptist Bible trailed 60-59 with 4:40 remaining before eight straight points helped lift the Crusaders past Central Bible, 72-67.

And Pacific Christian led 55-41 with 16:42 remaining, but had to hold on to edge two-time defending national Kentucky Christian, 88-85.

SATURDAY

Jason Filan hit seven 3-point baskets and scored 33 points to lead Northwest Assemblies of God past Southeastern for seventh place, 109-82.

In the fifth place game, Baptist Bible, Pa., led just 54-50 with 18:34 remaining when an 18-4 run sent the Defenders, who shot a record 70 percent in the contest, on their way to a 105-84 win over Jimmy Swaggart Bible.

Kentucky Christian led just 49-45 with 15:35 remaining when it outscored Central Bible 15-2 and went on to down the Spartans, 89-81, for third place.

Then in the national championship game, Terrell Cannon made 13 of 17 field goals and scored 33 points to lead Maranatha Baptist Bible to a 114-96 victory over Pacific Christian — which was also runner-up in 1989.






