We welcome you to Toccoa Falls College, nestled in the foothills of North Georgia.



On behalf of the Basketball Committee, special congratulations to the eight teams and their coaches who are participating this week. Best of success as you strive for the National Championship.

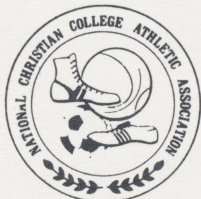

BAPTIST BIBLE COLLEGE

In the early 1930's, a small group of religious leaders in the beautiful mountainous region of Northern Pennsylvania felt the need to establish a school to educate young people in furthering the work of the churches in that area. In 1932 the dream of that group became reality when Baptist Bible College was founded in Clark's Summit. The enthusiasm, zeal, and efforts of that first small groups soon spread to the hearts of those who followed. From this small beginning, Baptist Bible has grown into a thriving college of 680 students and a seminary of some 70 graduate students.

As the name implies, the college is affiliated with the Baptist Church and is a member of the American Association of Bible Colleges. Degrees are offered in Theology, Religion, Education and Music.

Bible Baptist College is active in sports—fielding both men's and women's teams in basketball, volleyball, cross-country, and track and field.

Mark E. Jackson serves as President of Baptist Bible and Jim Huckaby is the Athletic Director.

KENTUCKY CHRISTIAN COLLEGE

KCC is a four-year private Christian college designed to provide education for Christian leadership in the church, the classrooms and the marketplace. The college is fully accredited by the American Association of Bible Colleges (AABC) and the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS). KCC seeks to develop the whole person by studying a Bible-centered curriculum with a strong concentration in the arts and sciences, by living in a Christian community, and by participating in varied Christian service. The college is located in Grayson, a small town in the northeastern corner of the State. L. Palmer Young is President of Kentucky Christian College and Dick Damron is Athletic Director.

FORT WAYNE BIBLE COLLEGE

Located in Ft. Wayne, Indiana, Fort Wayne Bible College is a co-educational four-year college specializing in the preparation of young men and women for careers in Christian service. The 400 students at the College represent 18 states

and 3 foreign countries and are from 28 religious denominations.

Fort Wayne Bible College, founded by The Missionary Church in 1904, has national institutional accreditation as a member of the American Association of Bible Colleges and regional accreditation by the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools.

Dr. Harvey Bostrum serves as President of Fort Wayne Bible College and Stephen H. Morley is the Athletic Director.

MOODY BIBLE INSTITUTE

Change. The 1985-86 season has definitely been different for the Lady Archers. When Nadine Brood stepped aside from coaching to pursue other responsibilities at the Institute, she took with her the stability of her vast experience. Then only 3 women from the previous year's team returned to play (a fourth rejoined in January). Coming off an 0-10 season, it was questionable if the Lady Archers could rebuild.

Change. In walked the tallest and perhaps most talented group of women to grace the Moody uniform. Lead by San Jose State transfer forward Wendy Elvord and Michigan State transfer point guard Kathy Roberts, seven new players arrived on campus to join with three upper classmen coming to for the first time. This group included 5 women 5'10" and more.

Change. Behind the rebounding of the 6'1" Elvord and the outside shooting of Christie Small, the Lady Archers started winning immediately, defeating NCCAA Division I Bethel by a 30 point margin in the home opener. In an overtime loss to a talented Ft. Wayne team, the women discovered character as they battled back from a 20 point deficit to take the game into overtime.

Change. In one season, the Lady Archers went from 0-10 to the top seeded team in the North Central region.

PHILADELPHIA COLLEGE OF BIBLE

Philadelphia College of Bible is a fully accredited, professional college offering four and five-year programs to prepare men and women for leadership in various Christian ministries.

Among the 31 programs offered are double-degree programs in Social Work, Music and Teacher Education, all approved by na-

tional associations in their respective areas. The Teacher Education program is certified by the State of Pennsylvania. Communications, Pastoral Counseling, Missions and Local Church Christian Education departments round out the professional areas of training.

Students are enrolled from all over the United States and several foreign countries. The more than 550 day-school students enjoy a 115-acre suburban campus in Langhorne Manor, a northeast suburb of Philadelphia. The College has been in existence 73 years.

NORTHWEST COLLEGE

Northwest College is a Christian college located on a beautiful fifty-acre campus in Kirkland, Washington, the "Gem" suburb of Seattle. NC offers a wide range of curriculum for the development of church leaders, educators and social workers. Accredited by both the Northwest Association of Schools and Colleges and the American Association of Bible Colleges, Northwest College offers a 1-year Christian Studies Certificate, 2-year Associate of Arts degree and the 4-year Bachelor of Arts degree. The NC campus is now the permanent home of the Seattle Seahawks, with three practice fields and training-administrative facilities.

TOCCOA FALLS COLLEGE

In the fall of 1907, Dr. Richard A. Forrest founded the Golden Valley Institute at Golden, North Carolina, to provide educational opportunities for young people in the South.

Realizing the need to be nearer a railroad for easier access, on January 1, 1911, Dr. Forrest purchased the Haddock Inn and 100 acres of land including the beautiful Toccoa Falls, near Toccoa, Georgia. On October 19, 1911, the institute moved from Golden Valley to Toccoa.

In 1937, a four-year Bible college program was initiated; in 1939, the State of Georgia chartered the college division and authorized the granting of Bachelor of Arts in Biblical Education. In 1957, the college was accredited by the American Association of Bible Colleges and in 1983, the college was accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.

Toccoa Falls College, an independent, non-profit educational institution, trains men and women for vocational and professional Christian ministries and works with many evangelical and Bible-believing Christian groups.

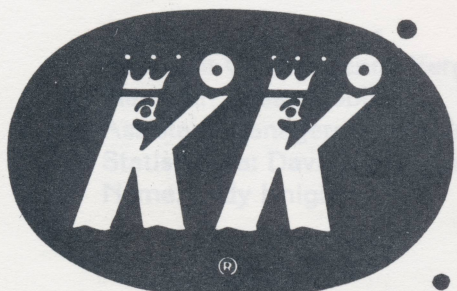
The president of Toccoa Falls College is Dr. Paul Alford and the Athletic Director is Charles W. Temple, Jr.

JOHNSON BIBLE COLLEGE

Although appreciating the prestige of being the second oldest Bible College in the United States, Johnson Bible College has kept pace with the advances of teaching in higher education. Johnson Bible College is a member of the AABC, is accredited by the Southern Association of Schools and Colleges, and in addition to offering a ministerial degree is also certified by the State of Tennessee to grant teaching certificate.

Johnson Bible College is located on the banks of the French Broad River, near Knoxville, Tennessee, on property which was owned by its founder, Ashley S. Johnson.

While enjoying the modern campus and teaching facilities of the school, the 400 students, faculty, and staff are ever mindful of the purpose of the college, best expressed in the words of its founder. They are inscribed on a plaque at the entrance of the "Old Main" Building: "Open day and night to the young man who desires above any other desire to preach the Gospel of Jesus Christ."
