
Rev. Jack Rozell...Dean, instructor and friend. These are but a few of the important roles our Dean of Students fulfills at Northwest College. He typifies the tremendours concern expressed by our administration and faculty for us—the students of N.C.

One is soon impressed with his sense of purpose, strive for excellence, and thorough organization. Such qualities are clearly evident in the record of his own collegiate activities. His college career at Whitworth College involved him in the national honorary Intercollegiate Knights as well as in the Whitworth Christian Fellowship through which he directed the activities of twenty-two gospel teams. At the close of his senior year as Student Body President, he was cited as an outstanding student with his selection for Who' Who in American Colleges and Universities. Following his graduation with honors, Dean Rozell pastored a home missions church in the Seattle area while attending Northwest College. Then, during his studies at Fuller Theological Seminary, he served as an assistant pastor. The next step was a three year pastorate in Montana prior to his appointment to Northwest.

The Dean's office is a busy office as he has unselfishly given many hours to campus life, problems, and progress. Those who have knows him as a counselor will remember his seasoned advice: "Love God completely with all your heart, then do what you want to do, and you will be doing His will.". This same spirit of total commitment is evidenced in practical ways whether he is in the classroom, at the ball games, in the pulpit, or in conversation on the sidewalk. He has a minister's heart and his challenging chapel presentations have unlocked the resources of the Word in a most appropriate way to the Student Body.

Many who have entered his office have smiled at the placard once hung above his desk: "Report Indian Raids Here." This ability to handle problems, his listening ear and his ceaseless ministry of concern are often taken for granted. It is for this reason that at the occasion of the 1969-70 Karisma, we express our sincere appreciation for his life's testimony, example, and "ministry of the second mile" for the Student Body.

Thank you for the privilege to serve you. May God bless you with His best.



## World Outreach Ministries




## CAMPUS M.I.G.








# Student Union Building








# Bookstore
